

Mt. Washington Art Market

Mount Washington has long been the place that visitors go to see the postcard view of Pittsburgh's Skyline, and ride on one of the historic inclines. But all the fun doesn't have to be just for tourists...

Did you know that every Saturday from 11am to 6pm (weather permitting) there are dozens of local artists showcasing their work for sale along Shiloh Street which intersects with Grandview Avenue right by the upper station of the Monongahela Incline? Up to 3 live performances take place each week as well to complement the selection of handmade jewelry, paintings, apparel, woodwork, and more. This weekly event has been taking place since Memorial Day and will be going on until September 4th. The Month of August will feature such musical acts as Irish Patrick, Bain and Crouth, Stevie Lee Combs, Cathy Stewart, and more. Every week be sure to visit www.vuplus.org to see which artists and musicians are participating.

While on Shiloh Street there are plenty of places to enjoy a meal, libations or an ice cream cone for dessert. Redbeard's Bar and Grill has just been remodeled and Havana a new Cuban inspired café is scheduled to open their doors soon.

Art Zebo Creations opens this month located at 26 Southern Avenue, just 3 blocks off of Grandview Avenue. They will feature handmade soy candles, natural soaps, and aromatherapy sprays, oils and diffusers. According to Greg Panza, Program Manager at the Mount Washington Community Development Corporation, who hosts the event, "The art marketplace is an excellent forum that allows emerging artists in the city to showcase themselves before an international audience at a low cost. Besides it's a great way to enhance the visitor experience along Grandview Avenue and encourage people to explore some more of our community"

Desiree Reicosky, a regularly participating artist remarked, "I didn't know where my candle making and aromatherapy hobby was taking me until the art market. I have been able to build a strong return customer base and it became clear to me that there was a place for me to open a store in Mount Washington."

Vincent Deandrea, Jewelry Designer said, "The Mt Washington Art Marketplace venue allows artists like myself to interact with the public. Allows us to see the face of our fans, but also for the public to see the face of the artist. It makes the process of buying a piece of jewelry much more personal when you are interacting directly with the artist in an informal fun situation."





Maroon 5

Maroon 5 has been consistently raising the bar on their musical career and the outcome has been nothing short of spectacular! The quintet based in Los Angeles, California, has been touring nearly nonstop since their formation in 2001. Prior to this time, four members of the group had been playing together since the mid-90s – their high school days – as Kara's Flowers.

With years of successes and an album under their belts, Maroon 5 added guitarist James Valentine in 2001 and the sky became the limit. Their album Songs About Jane received the honors of triple platinum sales in several countries, and they continued their rigorous touring schedule. The hard work was paying off. The band was nominated for and received the Grammy Award for "Best New Artist" and "Best Pop Performance by a Duo or Group With Vocal" in 2005.

A constant life on the road has its repercussions. In 2007 drummer Ryan Dusick left the band, just as Maroon 5 was releasing its sophomore studio album – It Won't Be Soon Before Long. Matt Flynn filled his shoes and the band played on. The change in line up didn't hurt their successes in the least. Maroon 5 held two tours between June and November and received the Grammy Award for "Best Pop Performance by a Duo or Group With Vocals" that year.

Maroon 5 released three albums in 2008, including a compilation and two live shows, and their most recent studio album – Hands All Over – dropped in September of this year. Produced by Robert John "Mutt" Lange and recorded in Switzerland, Maroon 5 will be touring in support of the new release. The first single from Hands All Over – "Misery" – can be

heard on almost every radio station in Pittsburgh!

Maroon 5 will be joined on the tour by American Idol Kris Allen and British Pops superstar VV Brown. Kris Allen won the season eight title, beating out the show's perceived front-runner Adam Lambert by a landslide in votes.

VV Brown cites her major influences as Aretha Franklin, Ella Fitzgerald and Dizzy Gillespie, and was offered (and declined) an offer to sign to P. Diddy's Bad Boy Records label. Her sound has been described as retro pop with an indie punk and rock edge, and her songs have been used in numerous television shows, movies and ad campaigns. Brown has performed with Femi Kuti, and has shared concerts with Ladyhawke and The Ting Tings. VV has been a part of several music festivals including Camden Crawl, the Great Escape, Evolution Music and the Glastonbury Festival. She recently completed a sold-out tour throughout the United Kingdom and was announced to open for Pink in her UK leg of her tour. In addition to her musical career, Brown enjoys a side project as a fashion model and fashion designer. She in recent issues of Vogue, and her vintage fashions can be found at www.vvintage.com.







Q: Should summer vacationers be aware of anything special in driving from Pittsburgh to Ohio?

A: In short: Speeding tickets are now evidently allowed even if state police only "guesstimate."

A friend was traveling to Cedar Point with his family and asked me the above question. I quoted him a CNN Report that said: "Motorists in Ohio, beware: Speeding is in the eye of the beholder, especially when police are the ones guesstimating."

In July 2008, a Police Officer Santimarino (P.O.) pulled over a Mr. Jenney (Driver) and wrote him a ticket, claiming to have clocked Driver doing "82 in a 60." Yet P.O. wrote the ticket for just 79 mph -- so that it was no longer 20-plus mph over the limit -- to save Driver having to go to court. Driver decided to hire a lawyer anyway to fight the ticket. In Barberton Municipal Court, the radar evidence was thrown out because P.O. couldn't produce his radar-training certificate. Driver hoped that allow him to win, but "[P.O.] testified that based on his training and experience, he had estimated that [Driver's] vehicle was traveling 70 miles per hour." Judge Fish amended the citation to state that "[Driver] was traveling 70 miles per hour in a 60-mile-per-hour zone." So he then had to decide if Driver was guilty for going 10mph over the limit. His defense was: with the radar evidence nullified, an officer's visual estimation alone couldn't be used to support a conviction. When that court disagreed with Driver's position, the case was appealed to the Ohio Supreme Court, which decreed: "Given [P.O.]'s training, OPOTA (Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy) certification, and experience in visually estimating vehicle speed, his estimation that Driver was traveling 70 miles per hour was sufficient to support [Driver's] conviction for driving over the posted speed limit of 60 miles per hour." But it evidently wasn't just about P.O.'s ability, since "A police officer's unaided visual estimation of a vehicle's speed is sufficient evidence to support a conviction for speeding ... without independent verification of the vehicle's speed if the officer is trained, is certified by [OPOTA] or a similar organization that develops and implements training programs to meet the needs of the communities they serve." Yet while the court said that an officer's visual estimate can be enough for a conviction, the emphasis was on the phrase "can be." It sounds like this court refrained from its role in supervising the government. How can a court not allow a radar gun reading due to a lack of a training certificate yet admit a much less precise police officer's visual estimate as permissible evidence? It is ironic that the Ohio Sup. Ct. cited P.O.'s "training, OPOTA certification and experience in visually estimating speed" when deciding against Driver, especially since visual estimates don't account for lighting, visibility, traffic, distance from officer to car, and other relevant factors. Visual estimation is not a scientific process repeatable under various conditions.

What's more, since prosecutors have the burden of proof, if an officer's testimony can carry the weight of conviction on its own, then a driver's ability to appeal is basically non-existent and the presumption of innocence is a nullity. This author believes that the "beyond reasonable doubt" standard requires more than just a "guesstimate."

One caveat is that police can already issue tickets for some infractions they only gauge visually, such as driving too fast or too slow for conditions. However, a recently introduced bill might make this discussion moot. The proposed Ohio law tries to pre-empt any arrest "based on a peace officer's unaided visual estimation of the speed of a motor vehicle, trackless trolley, or streetcar," meaning that radar, laser, or pacing would be required for a speeding ticket, no matter what the Courts say.

Until then, for the time being at least, there has never been a better time not to speed in Ohio. Just one speeding ticket can seriously impact one's finances, livelihood, and life; and in Ohio five miles can be the difference between receiving points and no points, determining if one loses a license and/or job. Best wishes to my readers for safe and happy summer vacations devoid of speeding tickets.



This month our review takes us to my neighborhood—the South Side where you'll be surprised to hear about a fabulous new "White Hot" night spot that serves up not only great drinks but some fabulous food as well. I'm proud to tell you about Villa Southside, located at the corner of 19th & Carson Streets. With a late night menu that beats any bar food, great service, friendly bartenders and an atmosphere straight out of New York City, this is a place that even us "slightly older" folks can still feel cool hanging with the young crowd.

The entire structure has been completely renovated from a former restaurant to a bar with several comfort zones. They built an open air deck that rivals any I've seen and the open air feeling makes the upstairs bar & dance floor that much more popular. Villa does have a dress code, they explain it's similar to the standard- no baggy oversized clothes, no athletic wear, no ball caps but the rule I like the best when dressed to my best is "no smoking" anywhere inside the establishment at any time. Villa doesn't even like smoking on their rooftop deck. I have to say it definitely does make for a much cleaner environment and the furniture surely won't have nasty burn holes.



I can't wait to tell you about the wonderful tapas we tried, but first- let me mention the drinks! Mike, our "Mad Mixologist" for the evening served up some pretty sweet (meaning specialty) martinis. We're talking Key Lime, Dirty Banana & Pomegranate concoctions that we were literally fighting over at the bar! It was such a nice mixture of martinis and a great representation of the kind of drinks Villa can wow you with. Mike (super

cute & single!) explained that they care about the quality and use only the best of the name brand mixers in their soda guns. It does make a difference, the drinks are fabulous. Now let's get to the food.....

First let me tell you that the full Villa menu is available online. Here's just a taste of the not only delicious but beautifully presented plates. Jennifer's favorite was the Pasta Roll Giovanni (\$7), baked pasta layered with sautéed spinach, prosciutto, mozzarella and ricotta cheese, rolled pinwheel style, served over Rosa sauce. This dish would make a nice light dinner as the portion was generous. I would order it along side the Stuffed Banana Peppers (\$9) breaded banana peppers, stuffed with a blend of pork, veal, and beef, fried golden, served over a smoky tomatillo sauce, topped with freshly grated mozzarella cheese. I have to admit it was hard to save a few bites for our other Nightwire staff. who were off busy taking photographs while we were eating. Ahhh, the benefits of seniority! When I said ahhh, I should have said Ahi, as in Ahi Tuna (\$12) Sashimi style tuna, seared rare and served with wasabi aioli and ponzo sauce. This was one of my favorites and not a bite made it to the photographers!

The food was flowing as the drinks were being refilled and passed around. We were served Lobster Macaroni & Cheese (\$15) Maine lobster lightly simmered in a four cheese sauce served over fusilli pasta. Definitely more along the lines of a dinner dish rather than a tapas dish because there is plenty to share for sure. Villa has a nice selection of seafood selections Gamberi Alla Proscuitto (\$11) grilled prosciutto wrapped shrimp accompanied with roasted red peppers and a fig molasses sauce. I swear I used my finger to swipe up that sauce. Villa also offers Fire Cracker Shrimp (\$10) a spicy coconut shrimp served with a tequila orange dipping sauce. If

shrimp is not your taste- you can try the South Side Sliders (\$11) premium Kobe beef served on a warm pretzel roll. This seems like the perfect late night bite and I'm glad to know that the kitchen at Villa is open late. They serve food till 11pm. The last tapas we tried was the Chicken Skewers (\$8) tender chunks of chicken grilled to perfection with veggies served blackened or barbecue style. Joyce couldn't figure out how they grilled the chicken to perfection, moist and juicy, seared on the outside without serving burnt vegetables but this simple tapas seemed to be her favorite. Simple and savory always gets her vote. The villa menu offers vegetarian choices of Risotto Fritters, Fresh Cut Fries, Sweet Potato Fries and Vegetable Spring Rolls. We're pretty certain that there's something for every taste and it's so much fun to order a few things and share. I love ordering a bunch of things and at Villa the cost is very fair considering the quality and presentation. How exciting that this is in my neighborhood. I think I'll be a

regular! I often find myself tired and hungry after a long work day not wanting to eat fast food- never - but wanting to patronize my local establishments who all seem to close around 9 or 10.

Villa has raised the bar on the South Side nightlife scene. They feature the best DJ's in the city, an outside patio, VIP accommodations, dancing and great food! There's no age limit too cool, so stop by have a martini and grab a bite to eat. This is a fabulous people watching hot spot that provides a stimulating atmosphere in one of the city's most vibrant neighborhoods.



To Those Who Pursue Learning

Part of rebuilding New Orleans (after Katrina) often caused residents to be challenged with the task of tracing titles to their homes... back potentially hundreds of years. Here's a great letter an attorney wrote to the FHA on behalf of a client:
