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

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



Driving Tips - Good Vision In A Downpour



How to achieve good vision while driving during a heavy downpour. We are not sure why it is so effective; just try this method when it rains heavily.

It is useful...even driving at night in the rain. Most of the motorists turn on HIGH or FASTEST SPEED of the wipers during heavy downpour, yet the visibility in front of the windshield is still bad..... In the event you face such a situation, just try your sunglasses (any model will do), and miracle! All of a sudden, your visibility in front of your windshield is perfectly clear, as if there is no rain. Make sure you always have a pair of sunglasses in your car, as you are not only helping yourself to drive safely with good vision, but also might save your friend's life by sharing this information with him.. It's absolutely amazing, you still see the drops on the windshield, but not the sheet of rain falling.

You can see where the rain bounces off the road. It works to eliminate the "blindness" from passing semi's spraying you too. Or the "kickup" if you are following a semi or car in the rain. They ought to teach that little tip in driver's training.. It really does work. This warning is a good one!

A 36 year old female had an accident several weeks ago and totaled her car. It was raining, though not excessively, when her car suddenly began to hydro-plane and literally flew through the air. She was not seriously injured but very stunned at the sudden occurrence! When she explained to the State Trooper what had happened he told her something that every driver should know - NEVER DRIVE IN THE RAIN WITH YOUR CRUISE CONTROL ON. She thought she was being cautious by setting the cruise control and maintaining a safe consistent speed in the rain. The State Trooper told her that if the cruise control is on when your car begins to hydro-plane and your

tires lose contact with the pavement, your car will accelerate to a higher rate of speed making you take off like an airplane. She told the trooper that was exactly what had occurred. The trooper said this warning should be listed, on the driver's seat sun-visor - NEVER USE THE CRUISE CONTROL WHEN THE PAVEMENT IS WET OR ICY, along with the airbag warning. We tell our teenagers to set the cruise control and drive a safe speed - but we don't tell them to use the cruise control only when the pavement is dry. The only person the accident victim found, who knew this (besides the State Police), was a man who had a similar accident, totaled his car and sustained severe injuries.

NOTE: Some vehicles (like the Toyota Sienna Limited XLE) will not allow you to set the cruise control when the windshield wipers are on.

Ask The Lawyer

Q Who Should Have A Will?

A. The short answer is: Anyone who cares about what happens to their real estate, personal property, and minor offspring if and when they should die. Every adult should review their estate plan when new life events occur, such as marriage, divorce, child born, other family changes (including a beneficiary’s situation changing significantly), or significant increase/decrease of your net worth (such as winning the lottery, selling a business, retirement with large benefits).

The purpose of a Will is to effect one’s desires regarding his/her realty, personalty, and children. To appreciate its import, one must understand what happens to a person who dies without a Will (a/k/a “intestacy”), where the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania dictate the distribution of the deceased’s estate and influence the guardianship of minor children and the funds necessary to raise them.


Our laws of intestate succession are inflexible and cannot address individual circumstances; thus failure to make a Will may result in an Estate Distribution which is contrary to your desires. For example, under certain intestate scenarios, it is possible that the still-living spouse of a deceased person would not receive that decedent’s entire estate. Another troubling example involves the death of both parents of small children: without their having made a Will, then the Court would be compelled to appoint a Guardian of the Person to raise the children and a Guardian of the Estate to manage the minor children’s financial affairs. As for individuals with fairly substantial estates (i.e., a very

significant net worth); at the very least, those people should have a Will in an effort to limit Federal Estate Tax liability. (Keep in mind that Pennsylvania Inheritance Tax is a separate issue.)

In order to avoid such forfeiture of control, most people should have a Will professionally prepared. While the above illustrations are not exhaustive of all circumstances in which a Will is desirable, a lawyer can help evaluate your special situation. As a rule, attorney’s fees to prepare a Will are relatively inexpensive when compared with the valuable peace of mind created by the existence of this document.

To be complete and not leave gaps in one’s estate plan, a thorough lawyer will also insist that a client prepare Financial and Health Care Powers of Attorney with accompanying Advance Medical Directive (a/k/a a “Living Will”) at the same time.

Pei Mussels steamed in a tomato fennel broth and finished with Pernod butter (\$8.50), a generous portion that quite frankly I was glad to not have to share. It was a struggle not to devour each perfect little mussel and the broth- to die for. Even the non-mussel eaters at the table used the bread to sop up the delicious broth. It'll be the first thing I order next time. I can see the bar and the micro—brew in front of me now. Add a Mélange of House Made Chips with a Horseradish Cream (\$4.50) OH! Okay, Serendipity does host a Happy Hour on weekdays from 5 till 7 where they offer a \$3.50 menu that includes some pretty special stuff.....wings, spinach dip, crab cakes and even a mini mac & cheese. I'm getting the mussels! But you can see where this is going. Great American food with a "serendipitous" twist! We sampled the Crab Cakes served with Citrus Aioli (\$7.25) along with THE most delicious house made herb focaccia with balsamic reduction & olive oil. Everything was so savory. The tastes and the depth of the dishes were so delightful! And I've just told you about the beginning!

I'm so excited for this new place in an old space that we love and have loved. Serendipity is located at 422 Foreland Street at the corner of James Street. Now this may be a little familiar because this was the former James Street Tavern and home of Sassy Marie's. Serendipity is timely, utilizing a great location in a great neighborhood with plenty of free parking and awesome food. They are truly creating an atmosphere ripe for serendipity.....happy accidents. Sounds intriguing, doesn't it? Let me tell you more.....

Now I'm always game to try Duck, Duck Breast prepared properly is utterly delicious. At Serendipity you are presented with Seared Duck Breast with Smoked Dry Cherry Sauce, Sweet Potato Mash and Sautéed Brussel Sprouts (\$22.80). So worth it! The Sweet Potato Mash was so unexpected but so delicious and if you have any degree of culinary savvy, the Brussel Sprouts were the bomb. Another thing that I love when others don't! The Duck was perfectly prepared with not a hint of "gamey". The smoked dry cherries seem like something Chef Joe Post could be selling out the back door to die hard foodies.

You'll have to try 'em for yourself and if duck doesn't suit your palate, he serves 'em in an other entrée that I could

barely stop eating- the Smoked Chicken with Dry Cherries in a Creamy Sage Sauce served over Rotini Pasta (\$13.50). This dish is definitely going to be a neighborhood favorite. Reminiscent of an alfredo sauce dish, this seemed so much lighter and with the sweet cherries.....I want some right now!

Serendipity serves up a great Prime Rib (on Mondays & Tuesdays) with Mashed Potatoes and a side of Bok Choy.

Luckily for us we were there on a Tuesday! And Bok Choy.....I was so grateful for something different. Bok Choy in a American restaurant- what a nice choice. We also sampled the Blackened Sea Scallops, Grilled Shrimp in a Saffron Rouille, served with Scallion Couscous, and our favorite Asparagus (\$17.50). I was getting so full and having a hard time not eating too much of one dish, but this was very beautiful and irresistible. It was so fresh, and the aroma so wonderful. We all enjoyed it but were decidedly taking much smaller bites! I honestly can't wait to go back to Serendipity with a bunch of friends who will all be pleasantly surprised. I almost feel guilty mentioning that our hosts paired all of the dishes that we tried with the most wonderful wines that complemented the flavors perfectly. Our server seemed

to know the list well and who doesn't love that? Wines by the glass or by the bottle, don't be afraid to ask questions! We perused, and you can look forward to a great selection.





The Rusty Dory, an Irish pub and grille overlooking the Ohio River along Ohio River Boulevard in Avalon, has recently attracted national attention based upon a history of unexplained paranormal phenomena. Originally investigated by Penn State University's Paranormal Research Society, Nightwire has been informed that a representative of a "ghost show" on the Discovery Channel is considering further investigation into the presence of several possible inhabitants that regularly, if amicably, haunt the establishment. 

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
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YOUR AGE IS YOUR BUSINESS...

The Clear Skin Diet *Written by: Alan C. Logan and Valori Treloar*



The Clear Skin Diet (Alan C. Logan and Valori Treloar) gives a nutritional plan to combat the age old problem of acne. While acne has long been a problem for adolescents, in the last fifty years acne has been on the rise among adults as well, particularly among women. I never had acne in high school or college. Even in my 20's my skin was

completely clear. As I entered my thirties, my skin became the bane of my existence, and I started my journey to figure out how to fix it.

Many scientists have traced this upsurge to changes in the dietary habits of North Americans. The Clear Skin Diet was written to help those who suffer from acne to understand what it is, why they have it, what it has to do with their eating habits, and what we can do to prevent it or lessen its impact.

Research has shown that there is a strong casual connection between certain kinds of foods and acne. It also shows that certain fats – such as Omega-3 fatty acids – protect against acne, while others – saturated or trans fats – can promote acne breakouts. On the other hand, culinary herbs like ginger and turmeric are known to lessen acne breakouts.

The same dietary stresses also influence the level of hormones that cause acne. While fruits and vegetables, green tea, soy, fish, berries, and fiber-rich whole foods lessen these androgens, meat and milk promote these acne-related hormones, as do sugar and low-fiber carbohydrates. There also is a strong connection between the brain and the skin. When a person experiences anxiety and depression, these acne-producing hormones are released.

This is a well-written, organized, and thoroughly researched book. The authors make clear distinctions between good and bad foods to eat, with a clear presentation style and discussion of the pertinent scientific studies. It is not new information, but an intelligent and comprehensive big picture analysis that made this book really worth reading. The value added here is in their

connection of the many studies that have occurred through the last several decades. They are also clear to emphasize the very best nutrients and separate them from the group.

It is noteworthy that after dealing unsuccessfully with this condition for years, from one dermatologist to another, one prescription to the next, the feeling of despair is likely to set in. The correlation of stress and acne is covered in The Clear Skin Diet with the same aplomb as nutrition, although some recommendations can be less convincing. It may be that stress, diet, and skin health are a Bermuda Triangle of cause-and-effect – we can't clearly locate what is causing what. It follows that the totality of the science presented in The Clear Skin Diet cannot help with one's despair: Do you really want to live a completely different life in the name of clear skin? Can you afford to change your work, diet, and leisure preferences? It is one matter to eliminate fast food and subscribe to a course of vitamins, but another to re-organize one's life around the prevention of acne via stress management; this book manages to fit in some suggestions like air purification, yoga, and spending one hour per night preparing dinner. But don't the most complicated among us also want to reduce stress? Don't we all basically spend our lives trying to be happy and balanced? So for me, there is quite an un-built bridge from stress reduction to acne cure. Stress is a part of life, and a wayside of accomplishment. The goal of clear skin is not really an end to a happy life; one wants clear skin as a means to confidence, an aid in achievement, and part and parcel of gaining respect.

Alas, I heartily recommend this book to anyone interested in this topic or afflicted by this disease. I have even gained a slight appreciation for acne as an early warning of more serious potential problems caused by inflammation and poor nutrition. The Clear Skin Diet has helpful hints along with suggested food choices. It is much more than a diet book; it is a health promoting, good sensible choices kind of book, in an easy to read, not overly preachy tone.

Personally, I've tried everything to cure this pesky ailment, except Accutane. I had always noticed dietary influences, but every time I tried to talk with a doctor about diet and nutrition they acted like I was insane and wrote me another prescription for an antibiotic and topical cream. This book provides the real deal truth and science about all the influences that create this debilitating condition.

The Clear Skin Diet is something that anyone with some skin problem should read. It presents a wealth of relevant information throughout the book and is well worth the money. Since applying the information in this book, my condition has been reduced by 95%... Many thanks to the authors!

Some say it can't be done, pairing wine with chocolate, but if you have the right wine to complement the right chocolate it can be a match made in heaven! Whether you are pairing a delicate white chocolate or a lively dark chocolate with wine, there are a few pairing tips to keep in mind.

Tips for Successfully Pairing Wines with Chocolate

Rule #1, typically the wine should be at least as sweet, if not a touch sweeter, than the chocolate you are serving it with. Otherwise, the taste may quickly veer towards bitter or sour.

When pairing wines with chocolate, your best bet is to match lighter, more elegant flavored chocolates with lighter-bodied wines; likewise, the stronger the chocolate, the more full-bodied the wine should be. For example, a bittersweet chocolate tends to pair well with an intense, in-your-face California Zinfandel.

Similar to "formal" wine tasting, if you will be experimenting with several varieties of chocolates, work from light to dark. Start with a more subtle white chocolate and end on a dark or bittersweet chocolate.

White Chocolate Wine Suggestions

White chocolate tends to be more mellow and buttery in flavor, making it an ideal candidate for a Sherry (consider the Osborne Pedro Ximénez Sherry \$20), for a Moscato d'Asti (try Saracco Moscato d'Asti 2006, \$13), from Italy's Piedmont region offers subtle, sweet bubbles, or an Orange Muscat (try Ventana Vineyard's Muscat d'Orange for \$18). The Sherry and Moscato d'Asti will pick up the creaminess of the chocolates and the Orange Muscat will pick up any fruit tones on the scene. Another route, for pairing wine with white chocolate is going for the contrast pairing approach, this is a little riskier, but when you find a match it can be exceptional. For example, taking a wine like a Zinfandel which tends to have a heavier tannic content and often a higher alcohol level and partnering it with a creamy, buttered white chocolate can have an unusual "melding" affect. It's like the tannins get softened out by the fat content and make for a remarkable potential for pairing.

Milk Chocolate Wine Suggestions

Pinot Noir (you might consider Mark West Pinot Noir \$10) or a lighter-bodied Merlot (try Hogue or Columbia Crest) will complement a bar of milk chocolate, a creamy chocolate mousse or chocolate accented cheesecake. Rieslings, Muscats (try Bonny Doon's Muscat Vin de Glaciere or the Bonny Doon "Vin de Glaciere" Muscat for \$15) or dessert wines tend to hold up well to mild milk chocolates. Also consider a sparkling wine or Champagne for pairing with milk chocolate dipped strawberries. Last, but not least a classic milk chocolate pairing to consider is a nice Ruby Port - a very safe bet when looking for a perfect wine to accent milk chocolate.

Dark Chocolate Wine Suggestions

Dark or bittersweet chocolates need a wine that offers a roasted, slightly robust flavor itself, with perhaps a hint of its own



chocolate notes. Cabs and Zinfandels have a history of perfecting the dark chocolate match, resulting in an unparalleled tasting combination. A Cabernet Sauvignon or a Zinfandel (try Ancient Peaks Zinfandel 2006, \$30) will more than fill your chocolate pairing expectations. Also consider a Pinot Noir or a Merlot to handle dark chocolate around the 55% cocoa mark. Finally, give a Tawny or Vintage Port a go to offer a very well balanced pairing approach to a dark chocolate dessert or truffle.



Preheat the oven to 220° C (428° Fahrenheit) or, when using circulating air, to 200° C (390° Fahrenheit). Place the roast on a roasting tray, rind downwards, and put it in the oven. After about 10 minutes, baste with water or bouillon. Turn the roast and add the onions, shallots and carrots. Leave in the oven for about 60 minutes at 180° C (356° Fahrenheit) or, when using circulating air, at 160° C (320° Fahrenheit). Gradually pour the beer over the roast. Remove from oven after the rind has turned a crispy brown. Strain the sauce and season to taste. Serve with potato dumplings and combination of sliced apples and red cabbage.



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

Music Green Skies A'comin'...

Greensky Bluegrass returns Picksburgh

I love music. Not just any music, but good music. The only thing I love more than good music is hearing it played by people with impeccable technical chops. That about sums up GREENSKY BLUEGRASS – a quintet of pickers originating from Michigan.

Greensky Bluegrass is one of the most exciting bands in today's music scene. Like a breath of fresh air, this five-piece band plays traditional bluegrass instruments and uses them to create original songs and soundscapes that are unique and new, yet somehow feel comfortable and familiar. Though they have been likened to '70s era Americana acts like The Band, Greensky would prefer not to be compared to any other bands. "We really just try to make music as a group that sounds and feels right to us", says mandolin player Paul Hoffman, later adding, "it is nice to know that other people really dig it, too."

While "green sky" is the opposite of "blue grass", the band insists that the name came about as more of a pun than a statement about their music. "Along with the tradition of bluegrass, we all have lots of different musical influences that we bring to the table", says guitar player Dave Bruzza, "and we somehow wanted to reflect that in our name." Upon witnessing the band's live shows, this statement seems to make a little more sense. On any given night, in addition to the myriad of excellent original songs, one might hear traditional bluegrass songs with an exploratory rock and roll jam or selections from the Talking Heads, Jimi Hendrix, The Grateful Dead or Bob Marley turned bluegrass. "We are as likely to play a three minute song as we are a ten minute song on any given night", says dobro player Anders Beck, "and I think that keeps it exciting for the audience". Perhaps this is the reason that

Greensky Bluegrass is as equally embraced by the jam-band community as it is the bluegrass/Americana community and the band's fan base is growing so rapidly.

Greensky Bluegrass is touring in support of their recently released fourth album, "Five Interstates", which was produced by Tim Carbone of Railroad Earth. The album, their strongest to date, features twelve original tracks and one traditional bluegrass song (a nod to the deceased King of Bluegrass, Jimmy Martin), and showcases the band's songwriting and playing talents in a way that is incredibly accessible to fans of many different types of music. Carbone notes on the package: "Five Interstates came together like five lives intertwined, the intersection of a lifetime frozen in precious time and preserved in a digital tableau. I'm blessed... We're all blessed to be witness to a band ascending as true as an arrow shot to the sky."

Since winning the 2006 Telluride Bluegrass Festival Band Contest, Greensky has been touring constantly, playing over 170 shows a year, and all the hard work is certainly paying off. Recent highlights are too many to list, but include selling out venues in many parts of the country, sharing the stage with musical heroes, getting asked to play shows with the likes of Tony Rice and Peter Rowan, Sam Bush, Yonder Mountain String Band and Railroad Earth, and being asked to play the inaugural Rothbury Festival in their home state of Michigan. "It certainly felt like an affirmation that we are doing something right", noted bass player Mike Devol.

Greensky Bluegrass rolls into Pittsburgh with the legendary Larry Keel and The Natural Bridge (www.larrykeel.com) on Friday, February 26, to play the Rex Theater on Pittsburgh's South Side.

This isn't just any old show... it's a bit of history in the making! Greensky will be releasing the first 2-CD set in a series of limited edition, live releases entitled All Access: Volume 1. 





2010 Census to Begin

WARNING: 2010 Census Cautions from the Better Business Bureau Be Cautious About Giving Info to Census Workers by Susan Johnson

With the U.S. Census process beginning, the Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft. The first phase of the 2010 U.S. Census is under way as workers have begun verifying the addresses of households across the country. Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will count every person in the United States and will gather information about every person living at each address including name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data. The big question is - how do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist? BBB offers the following advice:

** If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

** Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Do not give your Social Security

number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. ... Census. REMEMBER, NO MATTER WHAT THEY ASK, YOU REALLY ONLY NEED TO TELL THEM HOW MANY PEOPLE LIVE AT YOUR ADDRESS.. While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, YOU DON'T HAVE TO ANSWER ANYTHING AT ALL ABOUT YOUR FINANCIAL SITUATION. The Census Bureau will not ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers, nor will they employ solicit donations. Any one asking for that information is NOT with the Census Bureau. AND REMEMBER, THE CENSUS BUREAU HAS DECIDED NOT TO WORK WITH ACORN ON GATHERING THIS INFORMATION.. No Acorn worker should approach you saying he/she is with the Census Bureau. Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, the Census Bureau will not contact you by Email, so be on the lookout for Email scams impersonating the Census. Never click on a link or open any attachments in an Email that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.



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
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
