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# VOKOOOOOOOON...

The chants bounce off the walls, over the glass and across the ice. Every time the regular season backup goaltender turned playoff stalwart makes a kick save or flashes his leather, the crowd responds in kind. What hasn't been so kind? The playoff performances of franchise goaltender, former first overall pick of the 2003 draft, Marc-André Fleury, over the past few years. After two consecutive one round and done showings, with the butterfly specialist getting squashed by the arch rival Philadelphia Flyers most recently, this was to be the year of playoff redemption for the French Canadian, or Québécois, if you will. The first game against the New York Islanders proved to be a toe drag in the right direction for the much maligned net minder as he posted a shutout and the offense exploded for five goals. With fire power like that, would the team even need "flower power"?

You could almost hear a collective sigh of relief coming out of the Steel City. Woo hoo! Here we go! Our goalie won't do us in this year! And then . . . 14 vulcanized rubber saucers made their way past Fleury over the next three games, with the last outing being the worst, as he allowed an abysmal six goals on 24 shots in game four of the series. The new daddy accrued a 2-2 record with a save percentage of .891 and a 3.40 goals against average (GAA). I thought having a baby boosted an athlete's game! Rob Mackowiak, anyone?

You can't fully pin those miserable games on Fleury, as the defensive effort wasn't anything to write home about and it's my feeling that a little complacency set in after starting the series off with seven unanswered goals in five periods. However in the playoffs, the goalie must take his play to another level. NO SOFT GOALS ALLOWED. The puck stops there. At the goal mouth. Or in this case, in the goal mouth. It was time for that two year, \$4 million insurance policy General Manager Ray Shero inked in the offseason to pay off.

Stewing in the muck of the aforementioned collapse at the

hands of the Flyers last year and facing a longer than usual offseason due to a looming lockout, Shero knew it would be a while before the puck dropped to wash that awful taste of choke out of their mouths. He also knew he had too much talent on this team to waste away the golden years betting on an inconsistent playoff goaltender. So he didn't wait long to acquire depth in the crease. A 2012 NHL Entry Draft day trade sent the Penguins' seventh round pick to the Washington Capitals and brought the veteran Tomas Vokoun to the Burgh.

The Czech had a solid history in the league, albeit after a rocky start. Vokoun was chosen by the Montreal Canadiens with the 226th pick in the 1994 draft, yes, nearly 20 years ago, yet only played in one game with the Canadiens where he was assaulted by the Philadelphia Flyers for four goals in just twenty minutes. Hey, no worries Tomas. Fleury knows exactly how you feel. His stay in the Habs' organization was short lived as Vokoun was made available by Montreal in the 1998 expansion draft and selected by the Nashville Predators, ultimately winning the starting job in 2002 after Mike Dunham was traded to the Rangers.

Nashville was where Tomas Vokoun spent most of his career (1998-2007) and took his game to the next level, making a name for himself as one of the league's top tier net minders. He had a breakout all-star season in 2003-04 and helped lead the Predators to their first ever playoff appearance as a franchise. Although they were ousted in the first round by the Red Wings, Vokoun's 41 save shut out in game four proved his mettle. His playing career was interrupted in 2006 when he was diagnosed with pelvic thrombophlebitis, a medical condition that causes blood clotting in the pelvis. He fully recovered and was then traded in 2007 to the Florida Panthers for a first round pick in 2008, a second rounder that year as well as a conditional pick, as Nashville went into full sell mode. Vokoun still holds many of

the Predators' franchise records including wins (161) and saves (9,657).

To be traded for such high value picks speaks volumes of your work ethic and growth as player, especially when you begin your professional career as a ninth round draft pick yourself. Tomas Vokoun has brought that same professionalism to his time in Pittsburgh, skating up when asked, selflessly filling the role of reliable, consistent backup goalie. With all due respect to Brent Johnson, who has a heck of a left hook, the Penguins have been lacking a quality player in that position for a while.

As the unraveling of the second season version of Marc-André Fleury began against the New York Islanders this year, Coach Dan Bylsma turned to his capable veteran. Tomas Vokoun immediately stopped the bleeding and the Penguins advanced to face the Ottawa Senators and their shut down goaltender, Craig Anderson, who spent two seasons as Vokoun's understudy during his time with the Florida Panthers. Vokoun outplayed his former backup, posting a .935 save percentage and allowing just over two goals per game, while Anderson was chased twice in the series.

The offense is putting pucks in the back of the net at a blistering pace of more than four goals a game. But that doesn't diminish the consistency at which Vokoun has played, which induces confidence in the players in front of him. Overall, Vokoun is 6-1 in the playoffs with a .941 save percentage and a 1.8 GAA after two rounds of play.

Just like "Scary" Gary Roberts, Tomas Vokoun has become somewhat of a cult hero in Pittsburgh. In the age of wild fire-like spreading of trends and hashtags, the concept of "Vokouna Matata" has gone viral. I'm not sure of its exact origin however KISS FM's Freak Show has fueled a Vokouna Matata craze in Pittsburgh and beyond. Hockey enthusiast and ESPN host, John Buccigross, has used the term live on national television

and NHL.com writer, Shawn Roarke has also incorporated it into one of his reports.

So, what exactly is Vokouna Matata? Inspired by the song, Hakuna Matata, which is Swahili for "no worries," from The Lion King, the Vokoun adaptation reminds us that with Tomas in net, there's no need to worry. It's the "problem-free philosophy" of the Penguins. So far, it's been dead on. We will wait to see if the revitalized crease commander can keep it going in the Eastern Conference Finals to propel the team to the Stanley Cup Finals.

Vokouna Matata. What a wonderful phrase, indeed.

## *The Titanic Museum - Pigeon Forge*

The Titanic has always intrigued me, so visiting this museum was truly an amazing voyage. From the moment you enter the museum, the staff, dressed in costumes will make you feel and experience what it would have been like to board the Titanic. We were handed boarding passes with a passenger's name. Throughout the museum

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you will learn about the passengers, crew and eventually learn the fate of the name on your boarding pass. You will actually feel the adventure as you step into the various rooms and cabins recreated in the museum.

Visitors are given phones and in each room you will find a medallion with a number. Dial that number into the phone to hear stories and facts about that fateful day. They also offer a kids version of each medallion. During our visit the museum was dedicating its tours to the stories of the 133 children aboard the Titanic. It is the first and only world tribute to Titanic's Littlest Heroes and their stories are amazing. This tribute is very powerful and an emotional experience I will never forget.

Your journey begins by walking up the Grand Stair Case, I could feel what it must have felt like to be aboard that glorious ship. The various galleries tell the stories of so many and let you glimpse into their lives on that fateful day. The story that touched my heart was the cabin of one of the co-owners of Macy's, Isidor Straus and his wife, Ida. Traveling back from a winter in Europe, Isidor and his wife were passengers when, on the night of April 14, 1912, it hit an iceberg. Once it was clear Titanic was sinking, Ida refused to leave Isidor and would not get into a lifeboat without him. Although Isidor was offered a seat in a lifeboat to accompany Ida, he refused seating while there were still women and children aboard and refused to be made an exception. According to friend and Titanic survivor Colonel Archibald Gracie IV, upon seeing that Ida was refusing to leave her husband, offered to ask a deck officer if Isidor and Ida could both enter a lifeboat together. Isidor was reported to have told Colonel Gracie in a firm tone: "I will not go before the other men". Ida insisted her newly hired English maid, Ellen Bird, get into lifeboat #8. She gave Ellen her fur coat stating she would not be needing it where she was going. Ida is reported to have said, "I will not be separated from my husband. As we have lived, so will we die, together." Isidor and Ida were last seen on deck arm in arm. Eyewitnesses described the scene as a "most remarkable exhibition of love and devotion." Both died on April 15 when the ship sank at 2:20 am.





The Old Mill Pottery House Cafe and Grille

There is certain knowledge that can only come with experience, knowledge that can be taught and learned but simply understood more with time. Arcadia Ales is currently in their 16th year of production and throughout those years they have formulated a method that is unmatched in quality and creativity. Coming back to PA only a month ago after some revamping of the company, Arcadia Ales is going full-force, so expect to start seeing them everywhere and if you don't, just ask, they deliver. Located in Battle Creek, Michigan, Arcadia Ales has been producing British-inspired American ales since 1996. What British-inspired means for Arcadia Ales is that they brew in a traditional style, true to the British ales of old; there will be no lagers coming out of this brewery. The yeast they use, the styles they brew, and their place in the brewing community of Michigan is reminiscent of the way it was started across the pond.


Community is also a large part of who they are, helping out the other local Michigan brewers and the larger community as well. They like to keep it friendly. If a neighboring brewery runs out of a certain malt, for example, then Arcadia is there to help them out. They don't compete they collaborate, having multiple beer fests throughout the year for all the local breweries to promote their brews. As far as the larger community goes, Arcadia Ales throw fundraisers frequently to help the local zoo, marathons and various other community endeavors. So when you buy a case just remember that the money isn't going right into someone's pocket, but instead is helping a larger community.

Arcadia Ales has over 22 in their rotation, all very unique, all very delicious and all brewed with a special strain of yeast. To the beer geeks out there you may have heard of it and have some reservations about it, but fear not, Arcadia Ales has the venerable knowledge necessary to create memorable brews. Of course, the yeast that I am speaking of is Ringwood. It's technically a mixture

of a couple of different strains, blended at certain times during their aging. I won't go into the details, but for those of you who don't know about Ringwood, it's a very unique type of yeast. It's generally referred to with a love-it-or-leave-it dichotomy. However, you mustn't let this scare you. Everyone has a different tongue; some like dark beers, some like light beers and some don't like any beers (whoever they are).

Ringwood has its origins in Great Britain where its vigorous nature helped to produce the malty characteristics found in traditional British ales. What this means is that, like Belgium abbey yeasts, Ringwood will eat every possible fermentable sugar so you have to be careful when brewing with it, especially if you want to bottle condition a brew (exploding glass is bad). Also, Ringwood necessitates an open fermentation style of brewing, a style that is pretty rare these days. However, Arcadia Ales wants the full-fledged British authenticity, thus they brew all of their ales with open fermentation. I know, this may sound crazy to some of you home brewers, but rest assured there is a method in this madness. Imagine Ringwood as a living entity (because it is). It likes to get to know its surroundings, feel out the environment and adapt; it's still not entirely understood but when the brewer is good Ringwood becomes a faithful companion. Ales are top-fermenting, as opposed to lagers which are bottom-fermenting. What this means for Arcadia Ales is that Ringwood acts as a natural barrier to the outside world, so you can relax about the contamination of the brew. When fermentation begins the yeast starts to form a protective layer on top of the fermentation tank. Essentially what happens is when the yeast start to multiply they form a 3-4 inch thick layer of yeast on top; the layer that is exposed to the air hardens and effectively creates a natural closed fermentation system. And just for the icing on the cake, there's so much carbon dioxide coming off the tanks that anything living would have a pretty difficult time doing anything on top of the yeast.

But enough about the technicalities; let me introduce you to some of the brews. I'll only be able to scratch the surface of the plethora



of brews they make, but rest assured, their quality craftsmanship transcends their entire line.

To start us off is one of the most popular in Michigan. They didn't mess around with any fancy names, and the artwork is straight to the point. Their India Pale Ale is simply called what it is, IPA. With generous amount of dry-hopped Columbus hops, this IPA is the prototypical IPA: piney, and citrusy with a solid malt foundation to keep the hops in check. There'll be no puckering with this brew, but don't worry: they have more hops if you want them. This IPA checks in at 5.9% ABV and 41 IBUs.

Another Michigan favorite and summer classic is the Whitsun ale. An unfiltered pale wheat ale brewed with orange peel, coriander and local Michigan honey to enhance the sweetness is just about the perfect thing on a hot summer day. What's more is that it now comes in cans, making it more picnic-friendly. Now, before you go and jump on the anti-can bandwagon it should be known that can technology has come a long way from the metallic-flavored beer you might be imagining. At least as far as craft cans go, they're lined inside, so the beer doesn't actually touch any metal. They're airtight and impervious to light (so no "skunky" beer), they chill quicker, they're harder to break and they're easier to stack in a cooler or fridge. At 6.2% ABV and 17 IBUs go grab a sixer of cans, a friend and watch the world turn for a while in the sun.

Outside of Michigan the crowd favorite is Hopmouth, a DIPA to remember. Coming it at 8.1% ABV and 76 IBUs this brew is incredibly well balanced. Arcadia imports high-quality Maris Otter malt, a two-row winter variety of barley that produces a flavor that obviously comes from a product grown for quality, not quantity. The malt works to balance the pine and citrus aroma and taste from the hops, which makes for a brew that goes down maybe a little too quickly; or you might turn into a hopmouth.

Arcadia Ales has a bit of everything. They have a rye ale, a scotch ale, a porter, pumpkin, chocolate stout, Irish red, and that's not even including their vintage series. Like the great wine-producing coastal regions of the world, Arcadia Ales has a vintage series that pays tribute to the natural qualities and historic craftsmanship that goes into each product. These brews are all produced once a year and consequently they change a little every time. The series consists

of Cereal Killer, a barleywine at 10% ABV and 60 IBUs; a self-titled Imperial Stout at 9.5%ABV and 82 IBUs; Big Dick's Olde Ale, an English-style olde ale at 8.8% ABV and 51 IBUs; and last but not least the barrel aged Shipwreck Porter that's aged in 10-year-old Kentucky bourbon oak barrels for 12 months in abandoned mines in Michigan, 12%ABV and 50 IBUs. All four of these brews are perfect for cellaring, if you have the patience, so drink one now and save one for later, you'll be happy you did.

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# IC LIGHT mango

Summer in Pittsburgh usually means a few things: trips to Kennywood, Pirates games, Pens playoff games, and the Stanley Cup (hopefully), and amidst all this, beer. Not that we beer enthusiasts don't enjoy beer year-round; there's just something about the summer heat that makes a beer much more enjoyable, almost a necessity. There's a reason more beer is sold in the summer than in any other time of the year. Moreover, since June 2011, the palates of Pittsburgh beer enthusiasts have been treated by Pittsburgh Brewing Company to a sweeter, richer flavor when the summer months roll around, and the city's favorite seasonal will be reappearing this year as expected. IC Light Mango has been a huge hit in Pittsburgh since its release, and it's becoming more successful every year. In fact, it's one of Pittsburgh Brewing Company's most popular and talked-about beers. Part of the appeal may lie in the brand's seasonal schedule; as anticipation for summer grows in dull and dreary spring days, beer

enthusiasts envision the perfect companion drink to those summer days, and for many, no beer will do but IC Light Mango.

Over the past few years, flavored beers have grown more and more common, and fruit beers in particular see popularity spikes in summer months. I and many other beer enthusiasts enjoy a lively, fruity flavor when the weather gets warm, and Pittsburgh Brewing Company has put its stake in this new territory. But to say IC Light Mango goes along with a trend would be to sell it short. While the creation of IC Light Mango was undoubtedly inspired by the rise of seasonal flavored beers, it would be most apt to see it as an improvement upon the trend, not a derivative of it. Over the past month, I've treated myself to many different flavored beers, especially ones with fruit flavorings. While they are usually pleasant, they too often become overpowering, too sweet, to the point where drinking more than one feels like drinking a smoothie – I love smoothies, sure, but I don't want one where I thought I had a beer. IC Light Mango does not taste like mango juice in a beer can; it tastes like beer with a mango twist. The two elements, American-style light lager and mango flavoring, complement each other; neither dominates the other.

Not only that, but mango itself is not your typical fruity beer flavoring. Summer beers are most often lemon- or lime-infused; you'll see some that have orange, others strawberry, others raspberry, but you don't see mango-flavored beers that often. And, compared to the other fruits listed, mango is an especially tropical and summery fruit to flavor a beer. Pittsburgh Brewing Company chose mango flavor not only because it would differentiate its summer fruit brew from others but because it simply fits better. Mango beers in the summer just make sense.

So yes, fans of IC Light Mango have the beer's






triumphant return to look forward to, but there's something new in the mix too. This year will be the first that the Pittsburgh Brewing Company is offering IC Light Mango on tap in addition to its traditional 24-pack. Speaking personally, I'd prefer a bottle to a can, but a draft beer tops it all; the flavors are fresher and stronger, more pronounced. And this year we'll have an opportunity to experience IC Light Mango in this format. I intend to get a 24-pack of bottles of IC Light Mango, but I'm definitely going to make a point of getting myself to a bar that has it on tap.

With the combination of IC Light Mango and the newer IC Light Berry, Pittsburgh Brewing Company is putting its own stamp on the fruit-flavored beer world, but in a newer and frankly better way. These don't taste like wine coolers as do many other fruit beers; they taste like beer with fruit infusions. They're drinkable and not too sweet at the same time. A summer in Pittsburgh without IC Light Mango is like one without concert tailgates or sweltering heat: just not the same.





# Lancaster Brewing Company

Lancaster Brewing Company has a rich history that has made them what they are today. Back in the 1800's Lancaster was the beer Mecca for the United States, having 15 breweries in the county. At that time they accounted for only 7% of the beer in the country. They also referred to Lancaster as the American equivalent of Munich, the famous German city known for its world recognized beers. It was considered to hold the same position as in the brewing industry back at that time. As time went on, thanks to World War One and Prohibition, 14 of the 15 breweries had to shut down. During Prohibition the brewery had to do much of

their brewing underground to stay open. Eventually, due to the strains of World War Two and thirteen years of literal underground brewing, the tradition of brewing finally had to shut its doors in 1956. This created a 39-year gap in this storied history of brewing high quality and well-known beer. In 1995 a place called Lancaster Malt Brewing opened, looking to build on this rich history and tradition. Lancaster Malt Brewing was eventually bought and became Lancaster Brewing Company in 2001. The company has made a commitment to follow the Reinheitsgebot, which is the German purity law for beer that says you can only use malts, hops, yeast, and water to brew beer.

The Mile Stout is a very traditional style of beer that has its roots in England. What makes this beer so unique is the fact that it's a sweet stout, due to the type of sugar that is added. They use lactose sugar, which is non-fermentable, allowing the beer to retain a sweetness since it can't be turned into alcohol. That is also where it gets its name since the lactose comes from milk. However, since it's a stout it's still very dark and barley based, allowing it to still have the dryness. This style of beer used to be advertised as nutritional due to the lactose sugar and was sold to pregnant and nursing mothers since there were nutrients added to the beer.

**The Strawberry Wheat** is Lancaster Brewing's take on a traditional American wheat beer with a twist of strawberry to make it very unique. The fruit flavor pairs well with the beer because wheat beers are known for their more fruity characteristics in the first place. This also allows the beer to lend itself well for summer drinking and enjoyed with any food. This beer is also very refreshing because it's a lighter beer in the first place, and adding a fruit to this beer gives it an even more refreshing finish, quenching your thirst while maintaining its smoothness. This is one of the main reasons that it is such a good summer beer, plus it pairs so well with traditional summer foods.



**Hop Hop IPA** is a traditional India pale ale. This beer is extremely hoppy, even for an India pale ale, characterized by the hoppy flavor with the malty balance. This is a great example of what an India pale ale is: it uses cascade and fuggles hops, which adds a





citrusy flavor. This allows the beer to be refreshing even though it is on the slightly bitter side due to the hops. It just makes you want to drink more of it after having that first sip. It is also on the stronger side for an IPA with an ABV of 7.7%. This is comparable to the higher end of the single IPA and is on the fringe of what most DIPAs are. A DIPA is a double IPA, which means it uses double the amount of hops than a traditional IPA. Both have great flavors, but this one is actually in between both. It's not quite a DIPA, but it is more than just an IPA.

**The Pale Ale** - This exceptional American Pale Ale is brewed to be the perfect balance of floral hop notes and smooth malt flavors. Its crisp and refreshing taste will surely have you reaching for another. It contains: Malts: 2 Row Barley, Caramel Malts. Hops: Willamette, Fuggles, Magnum. OG: 13.5 - ABV: 5.0% - IBU: 34


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# THIRD SHIFT and REDD'S APPLE ALE

**N**ew to the national beer scene are two brews that will leave your palate feeling excited about the future. Launched early this year, Third Shift Amber Lager and Redd's Apple Ale both capitalize on current industry trends; Third shift following the trend toward decidedly quaffable yet flavorful beers, and Redd's being a fruit-flavored option with somewhat sweeter flavors. Both are unique, yet approachable additions to the ever-evolving MillerCoors portfolio.

When you have a passion for something, working for it is pleasurable. I'm talking about not working for a paycheck, not working to make someone else happy, I'm talking about coming home from your 9-5 and starting your labor of love, your third shift. That is what Third shift is all about, that's what it came from, that's what it's for, getting your hands dirty and loving every minute of it.

Originally starting as a side project by some of the most respected brewers throughout MillerCoors they were just having some fun, working their third shift. They would get home from brewing all day at the brewery and then work on their own recipe. Eventually they would enter their baby into some competitions and people actually liked it, which coming from professional brewers really shouldn't be that surprising. Nonetheless, they entered it into a couple other competitions with even more success. Next thing you know the brew was launched nationally and it's still booming.

The goal of Third Shift is to have a beer that acts as a gateway into the craft beer world. This is a great function to

those who aren't beer nerds and never heard of a nitro stout or gets scared by the word saison. Third Shift is an approachable craft beer. It's not something crazy, not a one-off, but it's vaguely familiar and different enough to conjure up some curiosity as to what else is out there.

Third Shift is technically a marzen or Oktoberfest (they're essentially the same) that pours an amber color with a nice





frothy white head. Thus, in layman's terms, it's an amber lager, but don't be fooled: this is not the amber lager you've grown up with (no adjuncts here). Some have even gone as far as to call it a Vienna lager; however, with my privileged information, I can assure this is not the case. A Vienna lager technically needs to be made with Vienna malt, and Third Shift does not have that. What it does have is two-row Pale and Munich malts as well as Taurus and Spalt Select hops which yields a brew at 5.3% ABV and 21 IBUs.

Referred to as a gateway brew, you might think a lager is an interesting choice for such a function. Lagers aren't exactly known for their fancy flavors, and most craft beers are ales. Luckily the brewers that brought you Third Shift have something in the works for 2014. So keep your eyes and ears open for the next Third Shift.

#### Redd's Apple Ale:

Blurring the lines between a cider and a beer is Redd's apple ale. Released only this past January it has been a hit with everyone. It should be made perfectly clear, however, that this is beer, definitively, and not cider. This means that, unlike cider, Redd's is not gluten free, so don't mistake it for apple cider. Cider is essentially fermented apple juice, whereas Redd's is actually an ale with apple flavoring added to it. Due to alcoholic classification and taxation laws there is zero fermentable sugars coming from the forbidden fruit; that would necessitate a cider classification. However, there is still plenty of apple flavor going on in this brew. Don't let this intimidate you if you usually shy away from fruity beverages. Redd's is not your average alcoholic apple beverage: it smells like an apple, tastes like an apple, but feels like an ale.

Redd's is a brew that transcends typical types of beer drinkers since it has such a range of characteristics. There


are elements of beer, malt beverages and ciders alike that effectively open up the brew to a much larger audience. Redd's is certainly sweeter than most beers, but it's well balanced with the tartness by use of a Pale malt base and Galena hops. Weighing in at 5% ABV you can stand to have a couple of these, and the refreshing crispness of the apple flavor just makes this sweet brew slide down. With Redd's you won't have to worry about pleasing all of your guests; it works for every taste for every occasion.

Keeping with the fruit theme, Redd's will also be releasing a new brew in the fall. This time it'll be strawberries that are added to the mix; a Redd's ale with a bit of strawberry. Stay tuned for more details to come. If it's anything like the original Redd's you won't want to miss it!

My favorite game was located on the top floor, which is where you will find duckpin bowling. Duckpin bowling is something



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
letter now.” The child told her father, returned to her mother and announced, “Daddy said never mind with the typewriter, he already wrote the letter by hand.”
