Penguins of Perseverance

There's one word to describe the Penguins' journey to their second Stanley Cup Final in as many years. One word that embodies the literal blood, sweat and tears absorbed into the will to defend their championship. One word that tells the tale of a season hell bent on history.

Attrition.

Worn down by injuries. Worn down by physicality. Worn down by resilience. But what's uncovered as the hits keep coming? A deep down desire, resolve and passion to ascend to heights hockey hasn't seen in nearly twenty years. A willingness to shelve egos and the tenacity to overcome a deck fully stacked against them. With a bullseye on their backs and the toughest division in the NHL to navigate, the Penguins touched the Prince of Wales Trophy, just like Sidney Crosby had done before hoisting his two Cups. But it wasn't easy.

The Penguins had 286 man games lost during the regular season, which included big contributors like Kris Letang, who missed half of the season to a number of ailments, ultimately needing neck surgery, Evgeni Malkin was sidelined for 20 games with lower body and shoulder problems and Game 7 hero, Chris Kunitz missed eleven. That injury bug stalked the Pens in the playoffs.

Never mind having to dispatch the Columbus Blue Jackets in





the first round, a team with the fourth most points in the league, followed by the Washington Capitals, once again the top point getters during the season, they needed a double overtime, heart-racing win in Game 7 of the Eastern Conference Finals versus an underdog with a chip on their shoulders. All of that accomplished with an injury ravaged defense and missing a huge net front presence in Patric Hornqvist for all but the opening game of the series.

It's no wonder the Ottawa Senators pushed the Penguins to the brink. They forced Head Coach Mike Sullivan to make risky decisions, yet they all paid off. The move to Matt Murray in goal after a Marc-Andre Fleury Game 3 flame out where the Conn Smythe Trophy favorite allowed four goals on just nine shots,





received plenty of backlash. But nobody can argue with the results. Murray rewarded his coach's trust with just seven goals allowed in 15 periods plus, a .946 save percentage and 1.35 goals against average. Conor Sheary was a healthy scratch in Games 5 and 6, then took advantage of his opportunity in the final game, flying all over the ice and assisting on Chris Kunitz's first goal.

"This group of players has a will to win as a group more so than any other group I've been around," said Sullivan. "They understand the opportunity to play this deep and compete for the Stanley Cup doesn't come around every year. And when it does, when a team like ours puts itself in the position like we have, we have to maximize this opportunity."

Sullivan always says the resilience of the group starts with its leadership, then defers to guys like Crosby, Evgeni Malkin and Matt Cullen. But that's not where it starts. It starts with him. The guys have bought what he's selling and the investment has paid off.

The Penguins' performance throughout the season had Jack Adams written all over Mike Sullivan, yet the second year head coach was not named a finalist for the Coach of the Year Award. The postseason run just throws that in the face of the NHL. Although if he wins back-to-back Stanley Cups, it's doubtful he'll care about the snub.

Pittsburgh Public Theater Presents An Act of God

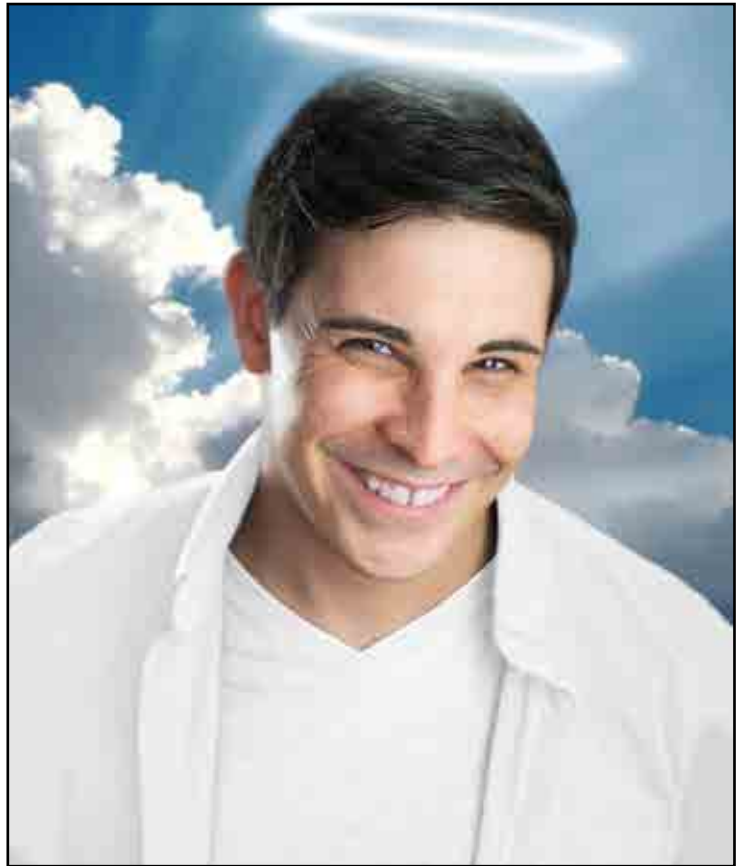
Directed by Ted Pappas and starring Marcus Stevens as God, the Ten Commandments get a reboot in David Javerbaum's satirical comedy.

Movie Reviews

ALIEN COVENANT

There are two types of people in the cinema world; those who think PROMETHEUS was a good film, and those who realize it was nothing but excrement on celluloid. The former will probably find some value in ALIEN: COVENANT.

ALIEN: COVENANT is an arrogant humanist display. The original Alien was similar to the Borg on STAR TREK: THE NEXT GENERATION. There was no need to seek their origins and discover why they were so nasty. They were the antagonists, and needed destroyed.

Scott must realize the deviation was lame, because he spends most of ALIEN: COVENANT attempting to restore the Alien to its original glory. Unfortunately, the damage may already be too devastating.

Speaking of reverting, ALIEN: COVENANT features a female heroine (can you say surrogate Sigourney Weaver?), an attempt to blow the Alien off the ship into space (can you say similar ending?), a fight between the heroine and the Alien involving a mechanical loading device (can you say been-there, saw-that?).

Charlie Henley is the Special Effects Supervisor. He creates alien worlds from Australian backlands and utilizes the H. R. Geiger designs with aplomb. Unfortunately, some of the backscapes have lackluster matting, resembling a 1980's poor blue screen look. The aliens must go through a quick evolution, which is a method of connecting PROMETHEUS with ALIEN: COVENANT. There is nothing quite as good as Alien, but we are subjected to a litany of incarnations that seem to be a deprived mating between the Pillsbury DoughBoy and the Michelin TireMan.

Pietro Scalia, as Editor, keeps the movie to two hours. He is dealing with a large sympathy letter, however, and no amount of cutting can fix a weak script. The first two-thirds of ALIEN:



COVENANT are tedious. I explain why in my full review on the official [OUTTAKES WITH FIORE](#) blogspot. Be sure to visit and click to follow today.

The spaceship Covenant is on a colony expedition with over 2,000 colonists and embryos traveling to Origae-6, a journey of eight years. An energy burst and a ghost message awakens the crew early and presents them with a much closer, Eden like planet as a possible substitute. When they explore the planet, they discover the remnants of the Prometheus project and the psychotic AI obsessed with creating the perfect lifeform. Their colonization mission now becomes one of survival.

Starring in a dual role is Michael Fassbender, who should have taken a few lessons from Brent Spiner for the parts. Katherine Waterston plays Daniels, and is never convincing as a woman warrior. Danny McBride is Tennessee. Normally a comedic actor, McBride is the only member of the cast who provides a credible



performance. ALIEN: COVENANT also stars Billy Crudup; Demia Bichir; Carmen Ejogo; and in an uncredited cameo, Guy Pierce.

The Alien franchise is becoming almost as muddled as the X-Men franchise, and that is not a good thing. I commend Scott for attempting to return to his original sci-fi horror classic, but truly everything from ALIENS to ALIEN: COVENANT, is easily nothing more than a box office money grab

GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY 2

There is an inherent predicament with sequels; how do you avoid a rehash of the original, and offer something fresh and new? When STAR WARS: A NEW HOPE exploded on screens, it set a high bar for space entertainment. STAR WARS: THE EMPIRE STRIKES BACK, provided the same spectacular sights, but enthralled audiences with what is arguably the best plot twist in cinematic history.

GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY set a similar scenario. A movie



based on a comic book read by a miniscule minority, it took viewers by storm. Presented in an extravagant visage, riddled with humor and classic rock, the film unleashed a box office blitzkrieg. Rather than taking the franchise to the next level, Writer/Director James Gunn opts to repeat the template and present viewers with redundancy in GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY 2.

Where GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY 2 falters is in the scripting. While the SFX are grander, the story is feeble. Rather than expanding the characters, Gunn settles for surprise star cameos. Watching GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY 2 is similar to watching the original; it's the same story told on a different street corner.

The Guardians are now heroes, and are commissioned by the Sovereigns to guard batteries that power their planet. When an interdimensional creature attempts to abscond with the power units, the Guardians display their prowess at organized mayhem, once again saving the day, but not before Rocket, the criminally deranged raccoon voiced by Bradley Cooper, purloins several of the prized batteries. The Guardians find themselves pursued through space by an irate Sovereign race, and their condescending leader Ayesha, played by Elizabeth Debicki. While evading their pursuers, the Guardians encounter Ego, played by Kurt Russell, who is Peter Quill's (Chris Pratt) father. The Guardians sidetrack their journey long enough for Quill to discover his dad, and the amazing world prepared for him.

Back as members of the squad are Pratt and Cooper; Zoe Saldana as Gamora; Dave Bautista as Drax the Destroyer; and Vin Diesel as Baby Groot. Back for a second adventure are Michael Rooker as Yondu Udonta; Karen Gillan as Nebula; Sean Gunn as Kraglin; and Seth Green as Howard the Duck. New to this story are Russell, Debicki; Sylvester Stallone as Stakar Ogord; and Pom Klementieff as Mantis. There are cameos by Ving Rhames, Michelle



Yeoh, Miley Cyrus, David Hasselhoff, Rob Zombie, Jeff Goldblum and of course, Stan Lee.

Editors Fred Raskin and Craig Wood pace the film well, but spend a little too much time allowing the viewer to goggle at digital images. The final battle sequence inside the planet are haphazard and frantic; reminiscent of the idiotic action sequences of the JASON BOURNE franchise.

Watching GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY 2 is much like sitting down and re-watching the first GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY. Gunn announced he is on board for writing and directing the third film in the series. Hopefully, he will expand his creative muses and not give us a third helping of the same recipe. There is a lot more to read about this film on the official OUTTAKES WITH FIORE blog. KING ARTHUR: LEGEND OF THE SWORD

One of the more endearing legends is that of King Arthur. It is a cultural mythos which encapsulates the whole of humanity, while allowing room for that which is beyond. I've seen a plethora of



films on King Arthur, from the sublime EXCALIBUR to the ridiculous KING ARTHUR, with Clive Owen. I believe the legend is best exemplified by EXCALIBUR. It is the film by which I hold all others to task. Knowing that, I can tell you KING ARTHUR: LEGEND OF THE SWORD is a fun spin on the folklore.

KING ARTHUR: LEGEND OF THE SWORD has Director Guy Ritchie's DNA imprint throughout each frame. There are historically inappropriate colloquialisms tossed in at key moments, providing comic relief in much the same manner as Kevin Sorbo's TV series HERCULES. There is Ritchie's trademark quick-cut edits that effectively blend dialogue with ensuing action; and there is enough twist on the legend to allow Ritchie great latitude, while still keeping the essence of the fable intact.

The tale begins before Arthur's banishment from royalty. His



uncle, Vortigern, played by Jude Law, has delusions of grandeur and world conquest, like most grandiose villains. He banishes and begins to systematically destroy all people of magic, the Mages, while using dark magic to increase his power. For this, he conspires with a demonic kraken, which is a clever SFX concoction of squid, sirens and corpulent spinster.

When his power is sufficient, he sabotages Arthur's father Uther Pendragon, King of England, and wielder of Excalibur, played by Eric Bana.

Baby Arthur is set adrift in a basket down the river in a dramatic escape, much like the myths of Hercules and Moses. He is adopted by the women of a brothel, and grows into manhood among the street people. Here the tale skewers as there is no boy king, for Arthur pulls the sword from the stone when he is a man, in this version. Arthur, played by Charlie Hunnam, reluctantly seeks to recapture his rightful legacy.

Ritchie adds an element of mythical magic to the tale. There are demonic elephant-zillas, giant rats, bats and wolves, while on the side of good are snakes, dogs and one big eagle.

Some of the action sequences are muffled, especially the concluding sequences when actors battle CGI monsters. The segments are a blur of swinging limbs and artificial colors. The version screened for the press was 2D. I suspect these scenes play better in 3D.

Although scripters Joby Harold and Lionel Wigram, along with Ritchie, play loosey-goosey with the story, there is enough tongue-in-check interplay to make KING ARTHUR: LEGEND OF THE SWORD a fun alternative. It is an entertaining film for anyone looking for several hours of pure escapism. I highly recommend seeing it on the big screen.

PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN: DEAD MEN TELL NO TALES

P.O.C.: DEAD MEN TELL NO TALES has some of the best Special Effects (SFX) I've seen in years. Nigel Phelps is extraordinary in his production design, reimagining such cinematic classics as THE TEN COMMANDMENTS, ZOMBIE SHARK and THE KEYSTONE COPS.

Johnny Depp returns as Captain Jack Sparrow. Playing the infamous pirate is the only lucrative outlet for Depp. His other films and characters have proven to be box office disasters. The foppish, eye make-up laden knave, who transforms to rogue swashbuckler after an infusion of rum, is certainly Depp's cash cow, and his swan song is epic.

P.O.C.: DEAD MEN TELL NO TALES opens with Sparrow falling on hard times. He's lost his mojo, to quote Austin Powers. No ship, no crew and no money, thanks to an incredible string of bad luck. To cap issues off, Sparrow's former nemesis, Captain Salazar, played by Javier Bardem, has managed to escape the

Devil's Triangle and is on a revenge quest for Sparrow's demise. Bardem is demonic in his portrayal. If P.O.C.: DEAD MEN TELL NO TALES is seen as his on-screen test for his upcoming role as FRANKENSTEIN, he passes with flying colors.

Brenton Thwaites stars as Henry Turner, son of Wil, who seeks to relieve the curse placed on his father. He is added in his quest by Kaya Scodelario, who plays Carina Smyth. She is Disney's Woman Warrior component; however, this time, it is done with panache. She does not heft a sword and waylay an entire pirate crew, which is always improbable, but rather provides elemental keys to their quest for Poseidon's Trident, the only treasure in the world capable of lifting curses of the sea. It's not long before Sparrow teams with Turner and Smyth in an effort to dispatch his hunter and regain his pirate mojo.

Geoffrey Rush returns as Captain Hector Barbossa. Also returning are Kevin McNally; David Wenha; Golshifteh Farahani; and Stephen Graham. There are also cameos by Orlando Bloom, the ever-lovely Keira Knightley and the musically talented Sir Paul McCartney.

P.O.C.: DEAD MEN TELL NO TALES is a fitting conclusion to a highly successful film series, based, never forget, on a rather unimpressive ride at Disneyland. The film is very funny, in both dialogue and slapstick adventure. The SFX are truly outstanding; and even though the film is over two hours in length, something I consider a no-no in the filmmaking business, it moves at such a pace as to make time irrelevant. And, isn't that the mark of a good film? As a member of the press, I had the opportunity to see P.O.C.: DEAD MEN TELL NO TALES in 3D IMAX. It is quite spectacular in that format, and if you have the money, it's well worth the extra nickel.



A Summer of Stone With Stone Brewing Company

Gargoyles are known to stave off evil spirits and generally promote good fortune wherever they are employed, and at Stone Brewing they take this idea seriously. Looking at Stone's logo or any of their beers and you'll find their figurehead gargoyle front and center, helping to ward off any evil spirits looking to do your beer harm. Gargoyles aside, it's what is inside the bottle that has made Stone Brewing a powerhouse of craft beer for more than 20 years and counting.

Stone Brewing Co. was founded in 1996 by Greg Koch (pronounced "cook") and Steve Wagner in San Marcos, CA. The first keg of beer ever produced by the brewery was their Stone Pale Ale, and while not in production today, it was the beer that launched an empire, so to speak. In their first year of brewing, Stone Brewing produced 400 barrels of beer, which was easily surpassed by the 2,100 barrels brewed in 1997. This tremendous growth has continued throughout Stone's history up to today.

Fast forward to 2016 and Stone Brewing produced 350,000 barrels in a single year. This steady growth should stand to show how consistently great Stone's beers have been and continue to be. Today Stone Brewing Co. brews out of their Escondido, CA brewery, which they've been in since 2005 as well as their newly opened brewery in Richmond, Virginia. For those with more European interests, Stone also opened their Berlin brewery in a former gasworks facility originally built in 1901.

To celebrate the opening of the new Berlin brewery, Stone is releasing a line of collaboration beers brewed in Berlin and imported into the US. Found in large magnum bottles, these unique beers are definitely not single serve, and as with the ideals of craft beer, are meant to be enjoyed with friends.

With breweries on both coasts of the US and in Germany, getting fresh Stone Brewing beer has never been easier.

The Beers

While Stone Brewing makes some seriously amazing year round beers, their seasonal program is really where it's at. By keeping things fresh and changing up the big unique beers throughout the year, Stone Brewing helps to give us a taste of something different while continuing to come out with new and interesting beers on a regular basis, especially those special Berlin-brewed beers we're dying to get our hands on.

Stone Tangerine Express IPA

Hops are amazing. Not only do they impart bitterness into the beer they're brewed with, but they also add a host of other flavors ranging from pine to pineapple to citrus and beyond. All that flavor hiding in the small flowers of our favorite bine.

An excellent example of this is Stone Brewing's Tangerine Express IPA. This beer is brewed with Citra, Centennial, Sterling, Azacca, and Mosaic hops to give it a fresh, citrus body that's then accentuated by the addition of tangerine and pineapple puree.

Coming in at 6.7% ABV and 75 IBUs, Tangerine Express is a refreshing take on the classic West Coast IPA style that's thankfully going to be around in 22oz bottles and draft year round.



Stone Ghost Hammer IPA

A fermenting beer never slumbers, or so says the folks at Stone Brewing and for good reason. The night shift at any brewery will tell you that when things quiet down and the night gets dark, those otherwise innocuous tanks and pipes take on a life of their own. Knocking, banging, and making all other sorts of ghostly noises while brave brewers and brewery staff do their best to assure themselves they ain't afraid of no ghost.

With this in mind, Stone is releasing a new seasonal beer named Ghost Hammer IPA. This 6.7% ABV beer is being released in cans and features Loralee and Magnum hops to give it a refreshing, bitter flavor that's perfect for summer days and nights when you need a little liquid courage scaring off some ghosts of your own.

Stone Mocha IPA

Now I know what you're thinking, hops...coffee...chocolate... really? Sure, on the surface these tastes may not initially seem like they go together but once you try this seasonal warm-weather

beer, you'll be convinced that coffee and mocha in your IPA is the best idea since beer and grass cutting.

There's something to be said about sticking to the traditional styles, and something else entirely to cross the unspoken boundaries and mix the ideals of an IPA and a stout to make an amalgamation of styles that somehow works perfectly. Brewed using cold brew coffee, this beer gives you all the coffee flavor you love without added bitterness.

While Stone's Mocha IPA is at its core a respectable double IPA, there are notes of coffee, milky sweetness from milk sugar, and a latte-like character that flows alongside the citrusy, juicy hops and the refreshing bitter finish. This seasonal beer comes in at 9% ABV.

Stone RuinTen
