


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# SPORTS IN THE NFL THERE IS NO OFF SEASON

The Trade Winds Are A Blowin' In . . .

At the time of this writing, the Pirates are fresh off an eight game winning streak where pitching had been dominant and the bats have produced just enough – the 11 run explosion against the White Sox notwithstanding – and head into the last week of June in a pretty good position at 39-28. Through 67 games last season, they had a losing record at 33-34. Currently the second best team in the National League behind the division leading St. Louis Cardinals, some might argue it's time to bolster the roster for a second half run at the NL Central, as the trade talks heat up before the deadline at the end of this month. The question is how much

will General Manager Neal Huntington be willing to give up, and what areas do the Bucs need to boost? Should the Pirates go ALL IN? And what does that even mean?

Last year Huntington was willing to go “all in” on Tampa Bay Rays pitcher David Price, an offer that was rumored to include some of the organization's top tiered prospects. Why? David Price had another year of control. Rent-a-players aren't typically the Buccos' bag. Marlon Byrd was an exception in 2013 and although he was of great value to the Pirates' playoff run, I'm sure Huntington watches the now New York Met second baseman, Dilson Herrera from afar and thinks what might have been, especially with the uncertain future of Neil Walker in black and gold.

But trade decisions and their consequences are not for the faint of heart or those prone to regrets. Many point to Oakland Athletics' GM Billy Beane as a master at making deals to benefit his club under the thumb of a limited budget, however last season he made two deals that were quite un-Beane-like, trading his top prospect Addison Russell along with the Athletics' number four prospect, OF Billy McKinney and SP Dan Straily to the Cubs for starting pitchers Jeff Samardzija and Jason Hammel. Samardzija had one more year of control, but Hammel was a free agent after the season. In a blockbuster, Beane added Jon Lester at the deadline and sent a middle of the order bat, Yoenis Cespedes to Boston in return. From sluggers to strugglers, the Oakland lineup suffered without Cespedes, with a team batting average of .225 and OPS of .632 in August and September. Beane's new rotation couldn't make up for the lack of offense and that led to a 22-33 record post trade deadline. Oakland clung to the second wild card spot, losing to the eventual American League Champions, the Kansas City Royals, in a game that Lester pitched. None of the three pitchers acquired are on the roster this year and Addison Russell is playing at Wrigley Field.



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So much for ALL IN.

But you needn't look far for a cautionary tale. Trading assets for veteran pieces was a way of life for Ray Shero, the former Penguins GM. His successor seems to be continuing the trend, looking to win now without an eye on the future of the franchise. On the other hand, all you need to do is gaze down General Robinson Street to find the model of consistency in the Steelers. Sure there are differences between the three professional sports here in town and their structures – you can't trade draft picks in baseball and there's no salary cap – but it looks like the prudent philosophy wins out over the maverick moves when it comes to roster building with competitive consistency over time in mind.

Huntington will have to remember the needs of the 2016 and 2017 Pirates when weighing this year's club. It doesn't seem like Walker is long for this team, as an extension would have probably gotten done at this point and a front office win at his arbitration hearing in the offseason tells me the team does not value the Pittsburgh Kid as much as the Pittsburgh Kid does. With the aforementioned Herrera in blue and orange, the Pirates' AAA second baseman Alen Hanson becomes quite valuable to the future of the Buccos. You can say the same for Josh Bell, the highly talented outfielder that was converted to a first baseman. The American League is calling Pedro Alvarez's name as the former first rounder's bat is experiencing a power outage, he hasn't overcome the yips and is making a defensive mess of first base. In terms of pitching, A.J. Burnett is done after this season and Charlie Morton has a \$9.5M team option in 2017 that they might not choose to pick up. That makes it hard to trade the top two prospects in the organization, Tyler Glasnow and James Taillon.

Plus, there's been a shifting landscape in the trade market – for years sellers were looking for young talent to build up farm systems,

then the second wildcard came into play and teams were on the buy/sell fence for much longer. Sure, they may not make the playoffs this year, but they were close. So there weren't many clubs looking to go into full rebuild mode. Rather, they were reloading and asking for major league ready talent. Might the Pirates put Walker and Alvarez on the block? They most certainly will be this winter, although the in-season trading of long standing team guys is a risky proposition. As professional athletes they all know it's a possibility, but the clubhouse is an important factor to keep in mind, and this group of guys is pretty tight. I doubt any of the core players get dealt in July or August.

And while fans might be clamoring for an earth shattering trade, a mid level deal is the most likely, keeping the top pieces in the organization right where they are and supplementing the bench and bullpen. If you really think about it, are there many realistic options out there for the Pirates in the trade market? A popular name to throw out is the Phillies' SP Cole Hamels, but the lefty has about 90 million left on his contract and despite three more years of control, that's a hefty price tag. Pitchers Johnny Cueto and Scott Kazmir are free agents after the season as are a bunch of other arms and we've already established Huntington doesn't typically do rent-a-players. There will be lots of talk and rumors circulating around the Pirates as the trade deadline creeps up, but in the end, Huntington will play the long game and put his faith in the team as constructed. Will you?

## **ME, EARL & THE DYING GIRL**

## **JURASSIC WORLD**

I do so love when a movie series returns to its creative roots and that happens with the release of *JURASSIC WORLD*. *JURASSIC PARK* was an epic film, and then Stephen Spielberg and company found a way to destroy its flavor with two banal sequels and by allowing Jack Horner to take part in the scriptwriting. *JURASSIC WORLD* brings the franchise back to the wonderfulness of the original.

I try to not watch trailers before I see a movie. Often, they are misleading. At best, the reveal too many key plot elements or scenes. Unfortunately, the trailers for *JURASSIC WORLD* permeated media in a major advertising campaign blitz. What I saw in the trailers alarmed me. Did I actually see Velociraptors work along side the film's protagonist Chris Pratt, as a unified force? It reminded me of *ALIENS VS. PREDATOR*, where viewers were force-fed the notion only a petite black woman could team with the Predators to defeat the Aliens. Please.

The raptors, in the same frame with Pratt, are not friendly creatures. Luckily, there are no "we are family" moments between species. I'll test your memory here, but think back to the second film in the *CREATURE FROM THE BLACK LAGOON* series; *THE REVENGE OF THE CREATURE*. In the film, John Agar, experimenting on the intelligence of the gill-man, uses an electric prod to teach the word "stop" to the Creature. Through Pavlovian testing, the Creature hesitates at the sound. It establishes a necessary reaction for the climactic scene. The raptors work much the same manner in *JURASSIC WORLD*. It is done well.

After *JURASSIC PARK*, Jack Horner attempted to garner his fifteen minutes of Andy Warhol fame and used rather sketchy paleontology findings to discredit the Tyrannosaurus Rex. Somehow, he convinced Spielberg to shift attention away from Rex. It was a bad move that culminated in a horrendous *JURASSIC PARK 3*. Horner's new Rex theories were dismantled by his colleagues within a year. He is now in the café of scientific oblivion, sipping coffee with the two researchers who tried to convince us of global warming with a fabricated hockey stick graph model. Rex is back in full glory in *JURASSIC WORLD*. In fact, he received cheers and applause from the preview audience when he appeared on screen.



JURASSIC WORLD makes many references to the original, and basically ignores everything from the sequels. It is twenty years past John Hammond's disastrous attempt to bring dinosaurs to a theme park. In that time, technology has improved, enabling Hammond's dream to become reality. Thousands of people visit JURASSIC WORLD on a regular basis, but as with all things, dinosaurs become mundane with the public and the park must find new and exciting ways to keep ticket sales booming. Enter Indominus Rex, a genetically built dinosaur hybrid, meant to add an element of fear and terror to park visitors. BD Wong returns as Dr. Henry Wu, and is the culprit behind creation of the new Rex. He is reminiscent of Dr. Susan McCallister, played by Saffron Burrows, in DEEP BLUE SEA, who created superior sharks, but opted not to tell anyone about the enhanced features.

In keeping with the Spielberg tradition of constantly putting children in danger, Ty Simpkins and Nick Robinson star as Gray and Zach, who are visiting the park while their parents attempt to end their marital bliss. Entrusted to the care of their aunt, the boys naturally find a way to immerse themselves in park havoc, while they discover the bond that exists between brothers. Meanwhile, Auntie Claire, played by Bryce Dallas Howard, while chasing the All American Woman Executive Dream, has the hots for Owen (Pratt), who is in this story what Robert Muldoon should have been in the first.

Critics were able to see JURASSIC WORLD in 3D. It is worth it. The dinos, especially the raptor attacks, are superb. The dinos look great, thanks to Ed Verreux's production design. Cinematography by John Schwartzman is excellent and provides several iconic moments sure to appear on posters and memes. Music, though featuring additional tunes by Michael Giacchino is basically variations on John Williams' memorable score.

All in all, JURASSIC WORLD brings the series back to where it belongs. You can watch the first one, skip the second and third, and jump straight to this one and have a better franchise. The movie is filled with dinosaurs and dinosaur action. It's worth repeated views and deserves a spot on your home video shelf. As such, it exemplifies excellence in film entertainment and captures the coveted Fist of Fiore Award for 2015. You'll like this one; it's a keeper, and winner of the 2015 FIST OF FIORE AWARD.

### **ANARCHY PARLOR**

ANARCHY PARLOR is a horror movie, without being a horror movie. While it has grotesque gory sequences, it contains no true elements of horror, like the supernatural, monsters or the things of myths and legends. Rather, the film attempts and succeeds in presenting a corny, but believable tale of ancient Russian traditions.

Based off the template for far too many films in this genre, a group of young vacationing Americans find themselves the victims of a tattoo artist who also creates family portraits on a canvas of human skin. Robert LaSardo is The Artist, a man tied into an old Russian family with an odd custom of immortalizing its family tree. LaSardo presents a creepy visage with bald head, scruffy goatee and body ink, but his voice needs considerable help from the audio board. It's too mild and high to be menacing. A weirder portrayal is offered by Sara Fabel as The Artist's apprentice, Uta. She is manic and demented and probably the scariest thing in the film. This film also marks the debut of Joey Fisher. Fisher is a Page Three girl, attempting to jump from men's magazines to the Silver Screen.

ANARCHY PARLOR was shot on location in Vilnius, Lithuania. The background and set shots are commendable. The gore-meisters create skinning scenes with appropriate blood and gore, but they are repeated too often to hold their effectiveness.

Written and directed by Devon Downs and Kenny Gage, ANARCHY PARLOR would play better with a more sinister antagonist and a more macabre plotline. While it tries, it never rises above a mediocre level, relying too much on the SFX guys and Fisher's nude scene. Sometimes the best element of horror is when everything is not explained. Wrapping up everything with a neat bow of logic, removes all the elements of uneasiness.

**SuperMonkey** - Marc what's happening! Bulletboys! They are back in black!

**Torin** - "I know right?! I couldn't be more thankful. The fans have been great and so supportive. The media as well. I mean our new song #2 with a bullet on the top rock station in NYC. Who would have saw that coming?"

**SuperMonkey** - I guess we should start with the obvious question, what happened to all the blonde hair?

**Torin** - "That's the silliness of the 80's man! I guess I liked it at first because people didn't recognize me. Now a days I just want to be myself so I'm just sticking with the black hair these days."

**SuperMonkey** - I think your resurgent success is very interesting.

**Torin** - "It's the internet man! The internet is the reason for our success."

**SuperMonkey** - I think it's a combination of several factors. One that you guys broke right at the tail end of the 80's rock scene when bands like Nirvana changed the direction of music and media. Smooth Up In Ya was a KILLER SONG! Everyone loved it and we all wanted to hear more Bulletboys, then all of a sudden that shift in the music biz and you got labeled a hair band. Then all of a sudden it wasn't cool to like that kind of music.

**Torin** - "Yes maybe and also the fact you couldn't get airplay in the 80's unless you had a ballad. Smooth Up was our ballad! That's really the only song we were able to get out and it broke us. I think bands like Slipnot and Voltbeat are amazing, and there are so many great things going on in Rock 'n Roll right now and you look out into the crowd and there's 30K people going nuts. Rock 'n Roll is not dead and the Bulletboys like to rock, that's what we do best. I've always hated that label of hair metal, what is that? It's rock 'n roll."

**SuperMonkey** - So you have a new album out titled Elephante' which is awesome, I can't wait to buy the vinyl. What's your favorite song on the new album?

**Torin** - "Kinfolk it's pretty personal to me. I was really down, didn't have a place to look to and I found my faith. I'm not a perfect specimen and I try to be a good musician. The song talks about having blind faith in something you'd normally do not have. Words that come out of your mouth can be powerful. These days I try to stay positive, have faith in something higher than yourself and I'm not talking about religion. I'm talking about faith and trying to do the best we can with what we have."

**SuperMonkey** - So you recorded recently at Dave Grohl's Studio 606 tell me about that that had to be a once in a lifetime experience.



**Torin** - "The energy in 606 is unbelievable - David Grohl and the Foo Fighters are hands down my favorite band. He has been carrying the flag of rock 'n roll yelling "No! Rock 'n Roll IS NOT DEAD! I have so much love and respect for Dave I can't say it enough."

**SuperMonkey** - I couldn't agree more, Dave is an amazing person and so inspiring. What are some words of advice for aspiring musicians?

**Torin** - "To be in this business you have to be a reinventing yourself, people get over you really quick. We're in a mass media world where they are always looking for the next best thing."

**SuperMonkey** - SuperMonkey - Like American Idol or The Voice. What's your opinion on those kinds of shows?

**Torin** - "I have a lot of good friends that work on some of those shows but I will say I haven't really seen someone go on that show and really make it to the level of success they promote. But I have seen those shows do wonders for the judge's careers."

**SuperMonkey** - That is so true, very good point Marc. Where does the name of the band Bulletboys come from?

**Torin** - Bulletboys sartered the band in Ronnie's garage in a big gang area of LA. At rehearsal there'd be holes in the garage and we could just pick up bullets from the garage floor. Then some dude, I can't remember who, said "Hey you guys should call yourself the Bulletboys!" It matched personalities it stuck."

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


# MUSIC LESSONS WITH LEGENDARY CONCERT PROMOTER PAT DICESARE

"You gotta be crazy to want to work in this business right?" Pat says as he laughs. He's joking, but not really. The music business is a crazy business, it defies logic. Booking agents screw up, then call you and yell at you for their mistakes. If the show gets cancelled as the promoter you're stuck with the bill. If you ask for compensation, you'll never get another act from that agent again. That's just how it is. Pat has seen it all. If you're read his book *Hard Days, Hard Nights* you know what I'm talking about. He practically invented the stadium concert. But you'll never hear him gloat about his success. In fact, if you have the pleasure of speaking with Pat, you'll find that he's got a lesson for every situation that can arise and more often than not, he's got some valuable information you can learn from.

I met Pat for the 1st time about two years ago. I had a funny thing happen to me. I had 3 different people say to me in a 2 week period "Do you know Pat DiCesare? You should meet him." I thought that was interesting that 3 people unaware of each other, said the same thing to me. It's like it was a sign. So I looked Pat up on Facebook and shot him a message. I asked him if he'd meet me for lunch, if nothing more, so that I can pick his brain. I didn't know him, and he for sure didn't know me. But he said yes. So I met Pat for lunch and I guess the rest they say is history. We've been working together on many things over the past two years and without a doubt he has hands down been the most influential person in my music career. I can't thank him enough. He's taken me under his wing and given me great advice. Like this gem I use every day. Like most musicians, I want to be compensated for my time. I had an offer from a club owner in Cleveland for SuperMonkey to headline but she couldn't come up with the money we needed as a band to at least cover our expenses. So I passed on the gig. When I told this to Pat he said "You have a venue in Cleveland that wants you to headline?! That's great!" I couldn't have been more confused. "How is that great, they won't come up with a fair guarantee and I can't pay my band?" I said. Pat replied "You gotta quit worrying about the money and just focus on being a great band. If you can do that, the money will come. Let's think about this, how can you leverage this opportunity to create another opportunity where you can make money?" I was enlighten. So I booked the show with no guarantee at Pat's advice and started to think outside the box. I also told everyone in my band what Pat said and next thing I knew, everyone was focused on being a great band and not the money. I put out an ad, I found some local Cleveland acts that wanted to open for us that were willing to presell some tickets. The owner of the club gave me contact info for all of the influential music bloggers, writers, critics in Cleveland. The next thing I knew I was driving to Cleveland to do an interview with the *Cleveland Scene* magazine. I meet with their staff, who did a great write up for SuperMonkey & SuperMonkey Recording Co. I sent that write up to my former college Kent State, and next thing I know, they did a whole write up on me as one of their successful graduates, who has turned



his marketing degree into a career in the music business. I was also able to use these articles to help book SuperMonkey in some better clubs in the city, radio, & TV appearance's because now people had heard of SuperMonkey. Same deal for Philadelphia, as a matter of fact, the owner of *Legendary Dobbs* liked SuperMonkey so much, she was nice enough to write me a letter of recommendation that I use every time I am breaking into a new market and anytime I want to play in Philly, I just let her know what date, and its mine. We've played Philly 3 times and each time we've made more money than the last time, and we're now at a point where we have to start looking for a bigger venue. All because of that one thing Pat DiCesare told me - quit worrying about making money, focus on being great at what you do and the money will come.

Pat is a wealth of knowledge and my greatest resource. If I have a question or a situation that I don't know what do to or how to react, I call and ask Pat for his advice and he's always there to take my call. Sometimes he calls me and asks me for my advice which blows my mind. Everyone in Pittsburgh knows his name from owning the *Stanley Theater* to all his years running DiCesare-Engler Productions. Two years ago, we didn't know each other and today I'm glad to call Pat DiCesare my friend and mentor. I'm not sure what I'd be doing if I had not met Pat. Probably working a job somewhere that I hate instead of doing what I love which is playing guitar and making records.



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# Stoudt's Brewing Company

The year is 1987. You can buy the top-selling Ford Escort for \$6,800, the world's population reaches 5 billion, Fox becomes its own TV channel, and here in Pennsylvania, the first micro-brewery since prohibition opens its doors. While 1987 had a lot of good times, the biggest event for us was by far Stoudts Brewing Co. selling its first beer (which happened to be the Gold Lager, still offered today) and starting a tradition that's still going strong today, nearly 30 years later.

Founded by Carol Stoudt, who also happens to be the first female brewmaster in the US since prohibition, Stoudts has made amazing beer since the time when craft beer wasn't a phrase anyone knew. Stoudts Brewing Co. is located in rural Lancaster County and currently offers around 20 different beers throughout the year, brewing approximately 10,000 barrels of beer each year.

Today, Stoudts Brewing Co. is owned by Ed and Carol Stoudt, and Brett Kintzer has taken over as the head brewer. Stoudts is a true family brewery that offers some amazing beers and a dedication to the craft that's hard to match.

## Year-Round Beers

The cornerstone of any good craft brewery is their year-round beers. These are the beers that breweries are known for and support the weird and wild beers made throughout the rest of the year. For Stoudts, the lineup of year-round beers includes four different beers, two of which have won multiple Great American Beer Festival medals.

## American Pale Ale

While APA is a style of beer, Stoudts makes their American Pale Ale unique thanks to generous additions of Warrior and Cascade hops. American Pale Ale has been the best-selling Stoudts beer for ten years running, and for good reason. At 5.1% ABV and with a crisp, medium body, American Pale Ale is everything you'd want in an APA and more. The best thing about Stoudts APA? It's even available in cans, so you can take it anywhere and have your beer protected from light and the forces of evil\*.

American Pale Ale pairs perfectly with grilled beef, marinated meat, and is exactly the right beer for anything spicy.

\*Protection against the forces of evil might be an exaggeration, but definitely from light, air, and best of all, cans are way better to recycle!



## Scarlett Lady ESB

Named after a red haired mind reader...wait, that's ESP...ok, scratch that. Named after the reddish copper color this beer has, Scarlet Lady is an English-style extra special bitter (ESB) that's rich, malty, and full of hop aroma and taste.

Scarlet Lady comes in at 4.8% ABV and pairs well with grilled or smoked salmon. If white meat is more your thing, then you'll love this beer with ham and marinated pork loin, too.

## Pils German Style Pilsner

The Germans know their beer, and specifically Pilsners are a specialty in the land of Oktoberfest. Pils from Stoudts Brewing is brewed in the style of a traditional German-style Pilsner that has a delicate dry taste that's followed up with a firm bitterness.

Like any respectable German-style Pilsner, Pils is a brilliant straw yellow with a medium body and the ever-noticeable noble hop aroma. Pils is 5.4% ABV, and is so good that Men's Journal voted it #3 for their best beer in America. You don't have to take my word for it either, as Pils has won 3 gold, a silver, and a bronze medal at the Great American Beer Fest. Pils is the other beer from Stoudts that's available in the can, making it perfect for concerts, the beach, and space travel\*!

Pils pairs wonderfully with seafood, chicken, and for the more adventurous eaters, it's a perfect compliment for calamari.

\*Ok, maybe space travel is going a little too far, but some beer will be the first one in space, so why not Stoudts Pils?

## Gold Lager

This is where it all started. The first beer brewed and sold by Stoudts Brewing back in 1987, Gold Lager is a Munich-Style helles lager that's been called one of the finest German-style beers brewed in America. Golden in color, Gold is brewed with a 2-row base malt along with three different types of specialty malts. With a healthy dose of noble hops to balance things out, Gold is smooth, balanced, and exactly what you want in a Munich-style lager.

Gold Lager comes in at 4.7% ABV and has won a gold, three silvers, and a bronze medal from the Great American Beer Festival as well as a World Beer Cup medal.



Gold Lager pairs well with roasted chicken and fish, and can even pair nicely with sharp cheese and traditional German schnitzel.

#### **Fourplay IPA**

The newest member of the year-round lineup, Fourplay is an American IPA that's full-bodied and chock full o' hops. This beer's hop character is thanks to Apollo hops that lend a citrus and resinous character to the beer as well as a super secret, eyes only clearance, black ops hop variety 06300\*. This experimental hop gives Fourplay orange, chocolate, and even some coconut character. This is a beer that needs to be tried to be believed.

\*About that black ops thing, I might be exaggerating there a little bit too, but this is one interesting hop even if it's not grown in a CIA safehouse...that we know of!

#### **Big Beers**

Year round beers are great, but it's the specialty beers that bring out the interesting side of a brewery. Each of the beers in Stoudts' Big Beers lineup are at least 7% ABV, topping out at a huge 10% ABV.

#### **Double IPA**

Stoudts Double IPA is, as the name suggests, a big double India Pale Ale. Coming in at 10% ABV and a whopping 90 IBUs, this beer is strong and full bodied, bringing with it some pretty intense hop characteristics thanks to multiple kettle hop additions and a very generous dry hopping.

#### **Fat Dog**

While this might be a little more than your typical oatmeal you have for breakfast, Stoudts Fat Dog is an imperial oatmeal stout that tips the scales at 9% ABV. Fat Dog combines the smooth character of an oatmeal stout with the hoppiness and alcohol you'd expect from an imperial stout. Fat Dog is big, dark, with a roasted malt body and a coffee-like finish.

#### **Triple**

The Belgians know a thing or two about beer. One of their greatest inventions is the Belgian Triple. Stoudts version of

this Belgian wonder is strong and full-bodied, coming in at 9% ABV. This specially-brewed beer has a spicy, phenolic flavor with some fruitiness that makes the overall taste complex yet extremely enjoyable. Triple has a warm alcohol finish that balances out the inherent sweetness of the Belgian Tripel style.

#### **Smooth Hoperator**

Sticking with what they know best, Stoudts brewed Smooth Hoperator to be a strong lager that has a delicate malty body that, while present up front, is quickly overtaken by a strong hop profile. Each barrel of Smooth Hoperator has 1.5 pounds of hops added to it, giving Smooth Hoperator both hop aroma and taste that's hard to beat.

#### **Seasonal Beers**

Along with their year-round offerings and their big beers, Stoudts also has a full lineup of seasonal beers, too. These beers are brewed specifically for their own seasons and represent the style most commonly associated with that time of the year.

#### **Karnival Kolsch**

A perfect springtime beer if there ever was one, Karnival Kolsch is a German style ale that's brewed using 2-row malt along with some red wheat malt to give Karnival a great malt backbone. On top of this sits German hops that give the beer both aroma and flavor. While this beer comes off like a lager, it's all ale.

Karnival Kolsch comes out in February each year and should be available into the beginning of summer, and is 4.8% ABV.

#### **Hefe Wheat**

Hefeweizens (German wheat beers) are one of the most refreshing beers possible for hot summer days. Stoudts version of this classic is brewed with half wheat and half malted barley to give the beer a special body that you can't find anywhere else. Like other hefeweizens, Hefe has aromas and tastes that harken ideas of bananas and cloves.

Hefe is 5% ABV, and is available starting in May and should stick around throughout the summer months.

#### **Oktoberfest**

What do you get when you make a beer that has a strong malt body, is amber in color, and has a floral yet not overwhelming hop aroma? Other than simply an amazing beer, what you also get is Oktoberfest from Stoudts. Brewed in the traditional German fashion, This beer, which is 4.5% ABV, has won 5 medals at GABF, and is available starting in August through the fall months.

#### **Revel Red**

Wrapping up the seasonal offerings from Stoudts, Revel Red is a deep amber colored beer that has pungent (in a good way) hop profile that hints at citrus and dankness that is superb.

Revel Red comes in at 6.2% ABV and is available starting in November and stretches through the winter months.

# Anchor Brewing Company

The craft beer movement as we know it today started around 1988 with breweries like Rogue Brewing Co. and Great Lakes Brewing Co. starting small in a world that didn't know what craft beer was. For that matter, neither did the new, small breweries. All they knew was that they wanted to make the best beer around and not compromise for anything.

Let's jump back in history from 1988, to the year 1871. It was in this year that German immigrant Gottlieb Brekle purchased a beer and billiards saloon and opened a brewery on Pacific Street in San Francisco. It wasn't until 1896 however that the brewery was renamed Anchor Brewing by Ernst Baruth and his son-in-law Otto Schinkel. Nobody's quite sure where the name Anchor came from, but it's widely accepted that it was meant to be a tie-in with the booming Port of San Francisco.

A series of unfortunate events hit Anchor Brewing, including the death of Ernst Baruth, the devastating earthquake and fire of 1907, and of course Prohibition in 1920. Between the repeal of Prohibition in 1933 and 1965 Anchor Brewing saw its share of change, but in 1965 a new era started at Anchor, known as the Maytag Era.

It was in 1965 that Fritz Maytag, upon hearing of the planned final closing of the storied brewery that he loved, decided to purchase a majority stake in the brewery in an attempt to keep the doors open and improve on the beer Anchor brewed.

In 1971, 100 years after Gottlieb founded the original brewery on Pacific, Fritz Maytag started brewing what would become the most recognizable beer produced by Anchor still today: Anchor Steam Beer. Even though nobody knew what a micro-brewery or craft beer was at the time, it was pretty evident that Fritz and Anchor were on to something pretty amazing, and were leading a revolution in brewing that was far from the light lagers that were popular at the time.

Jump ahead to 1984 and Anchor Brewing releases the first wheat beer produced in the United States since Prohibition to celebrate their 5th anniversary. Jump ahead even further to 1993 and we find another first for Anchor with the opening of their in-house distillery at the brewery; a first of its kind in the world.

Today Anchor Brewing Co. is one of the most traditional breweries in the United States, producing one of the few remaining



versions of the California Common, also known as Steam Beer. Anchor's beers are still brewed in handmade copper vessels in their San Francisco brew house with the same level of care that Fritz Maytag brought to Anchor nearly 50 years ago.

## **Year Round Beers**

### **Anchor Steam**

The beer that started it all for Anchor, Steam takes its name from a nickname beers brewed on the west coast in the 19th century were given thanks to the lack of ice during brewing and the often warm conditions they were brewed in. Much like the name of the brewery itself, the actual source of the Steam nickname isn't clear, but it's believed that it comes from the cooling of fermenting beer on San Francisco rooftops by the cool night air, creating a steam that rose from the warm beer.

Steam was at one time a nickname for all beer coming from the West Coast, but today it's a trademark of Anchor Brewing Company and only applies to this great beer.

Anchor Steam Beer is a 4.9% ale that smells of rich, semi-sweet malt with a bready, biscuity aroma paired with a slight hint of citrus. The taste can be described as slight caramel with a touch of citrus and the same busciuity malt character found in the aroma.

Overall Anchor Steam Beer is a great, easy-drinking beer that is well balanced, not too bitter, and has more than enough flavor to never be considered boring or overdone.

### **IPA**

Starting in 1849 the hoppy and delicious IPAs from England started making their way to the West Coast by way of San Francisco and while the gold rushers loved the refreshing bitter beer, it wasn't until 1975 that Anchor started the tried and true act of



dry hopping here in the US.

Jump ahead to today and Anchor IPA is a tradition that's only a year old, but off to a great start. Anchor IPA is 6.5% ABV and offers a great West Coast hop kick while keeping the malt profile nice and balanced.

### **California Lager**

Anchor's California Lager was first brewed in 2012, but its roots go all the way back to the beginning of the brewery and the Gold Rush. Made after California's first genuine lager, brewed by Boca Brewing in 1876, Anchor's version is a re-creation of this historic beer.

While Anchor's version isn't cooled in a mountain ice pond like Boca's version was, it's still a true to the original version that will surprise you.

The first thing you'll notice with this beer is the aroma, which is extremely floral, with some hop character showing through. The taste features crisp citrus notes with a strong, yet very drinkable bitterness that moves to the grassy, earthy category. California Lager has a dry finish that leaves a slight yeasty taste that is not unpleasant. California Lager is an excellent version of an American Pale Lager that has enough character to stand on its own, while still perfect for pairing with a variety of foods.

### **Liberty Ale**

Liberty Ale was first brewed on April 18th, 1975 to celebrate the 200th anniversary of Paul Revere's historic midnight ride, and it's still being made today. Liberty Ale is a 5.9% ABV ale that's made with whole cone hops and is also dry hopped to create a delicate yet satisfying taste that makes this American IPA surprisingly easy to drink.

The aroma of Liberty Ale features citrus in the forefront with some bready, yeasty characteristics in the background. The taste can be described as having pear and grapefruit present with a balance of malt and bitterness. Liberty Ale is naturally carbonated, which gives the beer a unique higher than normal fizziness and unique mouthfeel.

### **Craft Originals Variety Pack**

Can't decide on what beer to get? Check out the Craft Originals Variety Pack. In it, you'll get Anchor Steam Beer, Anchor Porter, Liberty Ale, and Summer Wheat.

### **Seasonal Beers**

Along with the year-round beers offered by Anchor, they also offer a seasonal beer for each time of the year.

Spring Saison – This beer is light, fresh, and spicy. Coming in at 7.2% it has a little kick to match up with the spiciness of a true Belgian saison.

**Summer Wheat** – The currently in-season seasonal, Summer Wheat is perfect in the can or bottle and is easily one of the most refreshing beers offered by Anchor. A wheat beer that comes in at 4.5% ABV, it's light, fresh, and just what you need for a hot summer day.

### **Autumn Red Ale**

When fall rolls around the calendar again, slightly darker and maltier beers are just what we need to stay warm. Autumn Red Ale from Anchor is a 6% ABV red ale that first saw the light of day in 2013. Malty with a nice hop profile, Autumn Red is meant for the fall.

### **Christmas Ale**

The tried and true Anchor Christmas ale is a great yet mysterious winter ale. Each year there's a new tree on the label and a new beer in the bottle. Nobody but the brewer knows exactly what the beer will be each year, but it's a pretty safe bet that it'll be great.

### **Winter Wheat (new)**

The newest of the seasonal beers offered by Anchor, Winter Wheat is a dark wheat beer that comes in at 7%. Made for cold winter months, Winter Wheat is malty with hops present in the background. This beer is earthy, woody, and perfectly what you need to warm up on a cold night.

# Ryeparian Ale by Western Pennsylvania Conservancy



Western Pennsylvania's waterways are among the defining natural features that make our region special. Carving out a breathtaking landscape like no other, the region's mighty rivers and streams are important economic and recreational assets, and have been for centuries. Restoring and protecting these waterways – making them cleaner, healthier and safer – is part of the vital and ongoing work of the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy.

Since 2001, the Conservancy's watershed conservation staff and volunteers have worked in hundreds of tributaries, streams, and rivers in our region's cities and towns to plant trees and native vegetation, remove barriers and debris, help reestablish wildlife habitat and rebuild stream banks. Their efforts have meant cleaner water for us all, healthier habitats for wildlife and better recreational opportunities for fishing, kayaking and boating.



And this year, the Conservancy's clean water efforts received a cool, refreshing and popular ally: craft beer.

Aficionados can now help to clean water by drinking beer, thanks to North Country Brewing Company, which recently released a new craft beer created especially to support the Conservancy's efforts. Portions of the sales of Ryeparian Rye Pale Ale will support WPC's stream bank tree plantings in natural areas throughout Western Pennsylvania.

Trees and shrubs, planted along the banks of waterways are essential to enhancing and protecting water quality. This native vegetation reduces runoff and flooding, stabilizes stream banks, filters sediments and cools water temperatures, all of which improves water quality for drinking and the many different aquatic species that call local waterways home. And the beer's "punny" name comes from the term for these important areas: riparian buffers or zones.

The idea for a craft beer to support clean water came in 2014 from two of the Conservancy's watershed staff: Eli Long and Danielle Rihel. Long and Rihel pitched the idea to Bob McCafferty, co-owner of North Country Brewing Company in Slippery Rock, Pa. McCafferty, who is a longtime supporter of the Conservancy by sponsoring the community garden in Slippery Rock as well as being a committed conservationist, thought the concept was ideal for him and his business.

"I'm a supporter of all who wish to coexist in a clean environment together, and a bigger fan of the Conservancy's efforts to achieve that," said Bob McCafferty.

It didn't take McCafferty and his brewmasters long to perfect and can the specialty ale. Within one year of Long and Rihel's initial idea, WPC staff, members, volunteers and the Slippery Rock community celebrated the launch of the Ryeparian Rye PA on Earth Day.

"Bob seemed to be as passionate as we were about the idea," explained Rihel. "It happened so fast. It is exactly what Eli and I had imagined - we're so excited...and it tastes amazing!"

For craft beer fans, this unique ale does not disappoint. Combining two distinct styles of beer, rye ale and pale ale, gives this beer a unique flavor of spice and hops.



“We wanted to create a distinctive beer for the unique work of the Conservancy,” explains McCafferty. “That’s why we chose rye ale, which is more rare and challenging to create.”

WPC has planted more than 28,000 trees along these important riparian zones since 2013, and plans to plant more if funding is established – so drink up!

# GAUCHO PARRILLA ARGENTINA... CULINARY ROCKSTARS

Hands down my new favorite place to eat is Gaucho Parrilla Argentina located in the Strip directly on the corner next to the 16th Street Bridge at 1607 Penn Avenue. Originally opening next door in 2013, in a very small space, (originally a small kitchen with a counter for taking orders, a couple bar stools, and some places to sit outside, weather permitting.) With the huge success of this small little restaurant, Anthony Falcon, Head Chef and Owner decided to double down in life and move into a newly renovated beautiful location, right next door. The restaurant is now double the size of its original dining room and includes more countertop seating as well as tables and chairs in the front and back dining rooms. Gaucho plans on adding a lounge in the back of the building once it secures a liquor license. For now, its BYOB with no corkage charge.

Gaucho has continually received rave reviews from food critics and foodies, which has built them an extremely loyal customer base. Yelp just recently named Gaucho Parrilla Argentina, Pittsburgh as one of the Top 100 Best Places to Eat in the U.S. and placed Gaucho in the Top Ten ranking them at Number 7 in the whole country. Congratulations for this well-deserved honor.

If you have not been to Gaucho then you need to get with the program and find out what you've been missing! Unless of course, you have something against the most succulent, tender, juicy, flavorful, wood fired meat in Pittsburgh. Then stay home, more delicious meat and delectable offerings for the rest of us. I'm just kidding, of course! Gaucho isn't just meat; they offer something for everyone with grilled veggies, chicken, seafood, fish, salads and so much more. Plus, most menu entrees come with sides and are offered in sizes, small and large.



My favorite item on the menu is definitely the Bandiola Con Pan Pork Sandwich (I've tried to try other things when I'm ordering, but it's so good it just begs to be ordered again and again.) Let's start with the bread. Fire-toasted Ciabatta bread, just crispy enough to have that great sandwich crunch, and gets a little soft and stays crispy while soaking up all the delicious juice. You know you love it the savory taste of meat juices and it would be such a shame to waste them. Bandiola Con Pan is slow wood fired pork shoulder roasted with onions, carrots, and celery until it is



literally so tender it falls apart. This tender, juicy succulent pork shoulder is piled high and then they add a nice layer of spicy Dijon mustard and caramelized onions. When you bite into it, it's a flavor explosion of everything that makes Gaucho so successful. You can taste the passion in Anthony's culinary art and this guy is a Culinary Rock Star. Creating a great menu is like creating a great piece of art. When you are passionate about something, it shows. You can tell that Anthony has put his heart and soul into Gaucho because his food is art you can eat. Absolute perfection! I have to tell you about the Mona Lisa of meat. The Gaucho Steak Burger. It's not really a burger per say, but more a mountain of juicy, tender, perfectly seasoned wood grilled chopped steak. You get to pick two toppings for your 100% beef patty like provolone, bacon, asparagus, or mushrooms. It's now my new favorite thing to eat at Gaucho. It used to be the Bandiola Pork Sandwich but after sampling the Gaucho Steak Burger I have to say this might be the best burger in Pittsburgh. I really don't even eat burgers; however, I can really crush a Gaucho Steak Burger on command. That's how seriously good it is.

I'd be remiss if I didn't mention some of the other menu items, like the Camarones, (shrimp). Gaucho uses white tiger shrimp and grills them on a cast iron skillet with olive oil, fresh rosemary, salt, pepper, and grilled lemon. They smell as delicious as they taste. Don't waste your time trying to go to the market, clean the shrimp, prepping to try and replicate this amazing dish, just go to Gaucho for shrimp that will make you come back for more.. Perfection, that's Gaucho's secret.

Gaucho also offers delectable sides like Gaucho Papas, or

chicken; sandwiches that feature chorizo (sausage) and seafood, mussels, shrimp, clams, calamari and fish; salads to which you can add any meat if desired are always available. Gaucho also offers larger plates for those with big appetites, like a sampler platter consisting of all five cuts of steak, enough for 5 or one meat loving man or woman!

Each dish can be enhanced by the condiments featured on the wood-block table in the center of the indoor dining space. All four sauces — the Chimmi Churri, Pimenton, Ajo and Cebolla — are



roasted potatoes (\$3) it's the right side dish to accompany any of their great meals. Papas are roasted with a blend of fresh rosemary, thyme, garlic, salt, pepper, and paprika. These same potatoes make up the Papas Cuna (Ku-na) which is an Argentinian style potato salad. It's mixed with fresh oregano, feta, mayo, and pickled red onion. Served chilled, it's a definite must try side. Other sides include, saffron yellow rice (\$3), maiz (roasted corn on the cob, \$2), grilled vegetables (zucchini, peppers, onions, tomatoes, portobello and grass (\$7 small - \$11 large) plus many other daily offerings. I have to mention the Provoletta Pequeños which takes an Argentine approach to grilled cheese. They grill sharp, dry aged provolone with fresh oregano, and serve it on tostado (grilled toast) topped with fresh arugula, lemon, olive oil, and Kalamata olive. It's addicting, just like everything I've tried at Gaucho Parrilla Argentina.

The menu is hand scrawled daily on chalkboards. Offerings are sectioned into categories; small plates like empanadas, grilled potatoes and sides; meats that include five cuts of steak: ribeye, skirt, flank, New York strip and filet mignon; pig (pork), lamb,

olive-oil based. Fresh herbs and notes of garlic, charred pepper and vinegar differentiate between the four sauces. Be sure and sample some of each to determine your favorite. Trust me, that could prove to be a real challenge... picking just one!

Anthony told us that he feels the context of eating out is changing, it's becoming about going to a small, little restaurant, having high-quality food cooked by high-quality cooks, without the pretentiousness of a dining room table, silverware, and chandeliers. It's cutting-edge.

Gaucho is definitely top-notch and the food is perfection... so based upon our experience and its recent prestigious award, we vote Gaucho Parrilla Argentina the Number One place in Pittsburgh to dine! For rock star food, service and overall experience it's Gaucho hands down. This is definitely a must dine at restaurant!



His Primary Care Physician sent him to a Gastroenterologist, which in turn sent him to Forbes Hospital for further testing and scans. They admitted him immediately, when the scans confirmed the worst: a diagnosis of Pancreatic Cancer. He was then scheduled for surgery performed by Suzanne Schiffman, MD at Allegheny General Hospital. John underwent a 13-½ hour Whipple Procedure. "As Cynthia waited out the time she became more hopeful the more time passed, because when doctors were performing my Mother's Whipple Procedure, after approximately 4-½ hour hours the doctors had to abort the procedure because they had found that her cancer had spread. She knew, that the longer it took the greater the odds of the operation being a success." After many scans to make sure, that all was healing properly he was sent home under visiting nurse care. He has been experiencing a loss of appetite and weight loss, which can be common during recuperation after this operation. He is now undergoing chemo and working his way down the long road back to recovering from this major surgery. "Everyone tells me I look good. It's been a long fight. After my Mom was diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer, I never thought I would hear those words mentioned to me...that I had Pancreatic Cancer. It was just like this HUGE kick in the head. I just couldn't believe it. My family, my Father was just beside himself to think he lost his wife of 50+ years to it, and now his son has been diagnosed with it."

And, as if having a Grandmother whose life was cut short by Pancreatic Cancer and a Father diagnosed with it wasn't enough, Jessica's husband's Grandmother also passed from Pancreatic Cancer. "Team Turkie" their PurpleStride Team Name is for the mix of the Turberville/Kisel families banding together to Wage Hope against Pancreatic Cancer, that has unacceptably touched their lives. John says participating in PurpleStride and with the Pittsburgh Affiliate meetings has helped give him closure with his Mom, keep him informed with what is going on in regards to Pancreatic Cancer and provides an opportunity to meet other people going through the same experiences.
