The Penguins did what no other team could do in nearly 20 years - win back-to-back Stanley Cups. It was a season that will be remembered for many things, notably their second consecutive championship, but also a number of factors that will shape the future of the franchise. The emergence of Jake Guentzel, the resilience and fallout of a battered roster and of course, Marc-Andre Fleury's swan song.

To finish the marathonic NHL year as the lone team standing after missing nearly 290 man games to injury in the regular season, navigating a sensitive goalie by committee situation and duct taping the blueline together throughout the playoffs, Head Coach Mike Sullivan deserves a Stanley Cup full of credit, although he'll defer to his group of leaders in the room. Most of which will be returning for another run, but not all.

As the Penguins begin their journey to three-peat, a feat not achieved in the NHL since the Islanders won four championships in a row in the early 1980s, there's some uncertainty surrounding the roster, especially the bottom two lines. With the acquisition of 30-year old bruising winger Ryan Reaves, GM Jim Rutherfod had to part with a promising young centerman in Oskar Sundqvist. Add in the question marks surrounding unrestricted free agents Nick Bonino and Matt Cullen, and the middle of the ice suddenly looks scant. We may have answers to this pressing need sooner rather than later as NHL free agency began on July 1st and if not,

Penguins fandom probably feels comfortable with Rutherford filling the gaps. He's done a pretty good job thus far.

One of the gap fillers this past season turned out to play a huge role in the playoffs, veteran defenseman Ron Hainsey. As the blueline thinned, Hainsey's minutes increased to about 21 per game, second only behind Brian Dumoulin. And while Hainsey will most likely leave via free agency, Dumoulin is one of the restricted free agents the Penguins should re-sign, along with Justin Schultz, who became the offensive threat he was thought to be when drafted by Anaheim in 2008. With Trevor Daley testing the free agent waters, these two defensemen are priorities for a team that relies on puck movers in the back end. A deal that might have gone under the radar, but is great for depth, would be the re-signing of defenseman Chad Ruhwedel to a two year contract worth \$1.3 million. A part of the patchwork defense, Ruhwedel played an integral part, including power play minutes, and is a welcome return to the roster.

Mike Sullivan is known to praise the leadership in this group, starting with Sidney Crosby and Evgeni Malkin, but also including some guys that may not return in Matt Cullen and Chris Kunitz. Retirement is a real possibility for Cullen and Kunitz has one last shot at a big payday. But the void they would leave wouldn't be nearly as big as the one left behind by Marc-Andre Fleury. The beginning of the rebuild into a once again relevant franchise,

Fleury survived the lean years, becoming the backbone of a championship team. A true professional, the 32-year old goalie left the Penguins as the all-time leader in wins – both regular and post season – and one of five players to win three Stanley Cups.

Fleury's legacy is more than statistics and championships, however. In his affable transition to the expansion Las Vegas Golden Knights, he leaves behind the grace, wisdom and humor with which he handled an uncomfortable situation, basically training his replacement on the job. His fingerprints will be all over the future of his successor, Matt Murray, and his smile forever intertwined with the history of this era of winning hockey in Pittsburgh. Fleury's last second save in Game Seven of the 2009 Stanley Cup Final versus Detroit will be etched in the memories of all Penguins fans, while his friendship and rock-solid presence in the locker room will never be forgotten by his teammates.

The Penguins enter into unknown territory next season, with a double dose of target on their backs and without the number one pick that started it all. Although as they've shown this past year, with Sidney Crosby and Mike Sullivan at the helm, anything is possible.




























Movie Reviews

NIGHTWIRE - FILM REVIEWS by FIORE



BABY DRIVER

If you take a quirky capper film, like Guy Ritchie's LOCK, STOCK AND TWO SMOKING BARRELS, and mix it with the primary concept of Jason Statham's TRANSPORTER, you'll have the foundation for BABY DRIVER. The film is an enjoyable action-thriller which is helped tremendously by a top-notch acting ensemble and a clever celluloid ploy.

Baby is Ansel Elgort. He is a driver extraordinaire, and a two-bit car thief. He makes the mistake of boosting the car of one of Atlanta's biggest crime lords, Doc, played by Kevin Spacey, and is in indebted to Doc to serve as a getaway driver for robberies until his debt is repaid. Baby had an accident when he was a young boy which left him with a severe case of tinnitus. As an aide, he constantly listens to, and bases his driving off music.

Doc is a smooth operator. He orchestrates major heists throughout the Atlanta area, but never uses the same crew twice. This enables us to see a nice collection of villains including: Jamie Foxx as Bats; John Hamm, as Buddy; Elza Gonzalez as Darling; and Jon Bernthal as Griff.

Bernthal's role is a mere cameo. It's too bad THE PUNISHER didn't have a larger part; he is intense in his short screen time. Lily James enters the story as Debora, Baby's love interest.

Foxx is exceptional in his part. Normally, he has a contract which restricts the types of characters he can portray. He always requires he play the role of a positive black man with solid values. That clause is ignored in BABY DRIVER, thankfully. The clause was truly limited Foxx's characters. He plays Bats, a psychotic thief who justifies his ruthless actions through misguided victimization. It's one of Foxx's best roles in a number of years.

While much of the story is told in flashback, we pick up the tale just as Baby is on the verge of repaying Doc. Naturally, once the debt is paid, there is one more job Baby is coerced into doing, and it is the heist that envelopes Murphy's Law.

Bill Pope, one of Hollywood's camera icons, provides bonejarring shots during the action sequences, with the assistance of Stunt Co-ordinator Darrin Prescott. He compliments them with close-ups during the dialogue shots, except for Doc, who isn't seen in close up until the film's conclusion. It's solid cinematography, and I would expect nothing less from Pope.

Steven Price orchestrates the soundtrack, which consists of over thirty contemporary and classic songs. The music is essential to BABY DRIVER. All the film's action, and even select parts of the dialogue, are set to the beat of the song playing. Carl doors, racking gun slides, footfalls, counting money, all are done to the rhythm of the music. It's a cool celluloid ploy. I don't know if I like to watch every movie like this, but for BABY DRIVER, it works just fine and provides fun, even in the film's slow points.

For those slow points, blame Editors Paul Machliss and Jonathan Amos. Most of the film is delivered with a quick pace, even the flashback sequences, but something goes terribly wrong in the middle of the second act. The film lags, and all the momentum built dissipates quickly. The beginning of act three requires a new wave of intensity. I'll blame this, once again, on the use of more than one editor. It is proving to be a maxim with augmenting proof.

Director and writer Edgar Wright crafts a nifty action thriller with BABY DRIVER. The action/music syncing ploy brings the film to a higher level. If you are looking for a few hours of cinematic conflict, tossed with a bit of humor, an odd-ball main character and a solid supporting cast, BABY DRIVER will fill the bill.

THE MUMMY

THE MUMMY is a decent monster movie and an excellent introduction into the newly conceived Dark Universe.

Universal Pictures toyed with the concept of resurrecting its classic staple of monsters in modernized films.

After the proliferation of superhero movies, and the concept of introducing solo films followed by team blockbusters for both Marvel and DC, Universal decided a similar concept would fit its monster revitalization. THE MUMMY is the first in the series, and it sets up the Dark Universe rather nicely.

Tom Cruise plays Nick Morton, a military operative who is actually a thief and scoundrel. He uses his manly wiles to purloin a map from archeologist Jenny Halsey, played by Annabelle Wallis, which he believes leads to a hidden treasure. Together with his sidekick Chris Vail, played by Jake Johnson, the two set out for untold fortunes, only to unleash an ancient evil; a mummy demon called Ahmanet, played by Sofia Boutella.

This is a stark contrast to the MUMMY legend we know and love. Gone is Boris Karloff's Imhotep, and Lon Chaney Jr.'s Kharis, searching through the centuries for their long-lost loves. Now, it is the woman who travels time, looking for her man.

The Dark Universe truly unfolds when Nick discovers Jenny is part of a secret society which hunts and contains all forms of monstrous evil. She takes Nick to the society's headquarters, and there they encounter Dr. Henry Jekyll, played by Russell Crowe. Crowe is rather magnanimous in his portrayal and it is evident he is anxious to make extended cameo appearances in future Dark Universe films. Touring his lab, viewers are treated to a plethora of Easter Eggs for upcoming films, including the infamous arm skeleton of The Creature from the Black Lagoon, the skull of Dracula, the bandages and sunglasses from the Invisible Man, and a brain used in the experiments of Dr. Frankenstein.

Technically, THE MUMMY misses a few steps, especially in the beginning. The opening reels, establishing the set-up, seem disoriented and a bit sloppy. Once again, I attribute this to too many editors on the project. THE MUMMY uses three.

Considering Cruise's ability to fight in action sequences, the ones in THE MUMMY are more in line with Crowe's GLADIATOR. They are shot with close-ups and quick cut edits. Not a fan.

I saw THE MUMMY in regular 2D. It looked fine, so unless you are a 3D fanatic, this one plays well in regular format. Plenty more to say about this film, in my full length review on the official blog: outtakeswithfiore.blogspot.com. Check it out, today.

WONDER WOMAN

The first step to Warner Bros' THE JUSTICE LEAGUE OF AMERICA is WONDER WOMAN, starring Gal Gadot and Chris Pine. Let's hope the JUSTICE LEAGUE is considerably better than

WONDER WOMAN, which is a plodding, estrogen-filled excuse for a superhero movie. It shifts constantly between the superhero genre and a Lifetime Movie of the Week. The film is an exercise in how not to assemble a superhero movie.

To begin, the character of WONDER WOMAN undergoes a metamorphosis greater than Bruce Banner. I'm probably showing my age here, but I remember WONDER WOMAN as an Amazon warrior. She had incredible strength, could leap like THE HULK, had a magic lasso, power bracelets, a sword and shield and she rode around in an invisible airplane.

This new version of WONDER WOMAN still has the bracelets, lasso, shield and sword, but has ditched the plane because she can fly, like SUPERMAN. She is no longer an Amazon warrior, but a god from Olympus; the daughter of Zeus, which makes her HERCULES' sister.

In the concluding reels, WONDER WOMAN harnesses lightning bolts like THOR, and shoots laser beams and power rays from her bracelets. Coupled with a few poor matting sequences and the final reel plays like the pages of a meagre Magna comic.

Director Patty Jenkins begins the film in grand fashion. It has all the markings of a superhero epic, but then, at the beginning of Act Two, she brings the quicksand. WONDER WOMAN bogs to an incredibly slow pace. All momentum built dissipates and viewers are treated to fifty minutes of Kumbaya and John Lennon's "All You Need Is Love". Jenkins worked with Editor Martin Walsh, but retained final editing decisions. It's not that Screenwriter Allan Heinberg penned a bad tale. It's just assembled poorly.

Gal Gadot makes a good WONDER WOMAN. As her showcase piece, this could have been a lot stronger. When you have good characters, a decent script and competent folks behind the camera, and the production just doesn't work, pin it on the director. In this instance, Jenkins is clearly out of her depth.

Fanboys will love WONDER WOMAN, as will those smitten with Gadot's incredible looks and screen presence. I'm glad I saw WONDER WOMAN. I enjoy superhero movies. But, I wouldn't sit through this one again.

July 4th holds a very special place in our hearts, as not only is it the annual celebration of the founding of our great nation, it's the perfect time for fun with friends and family, cooking out on the grill, and of course for some great beer. Just like the American Experiment, craft beer thrives on being independent, which is one of the core requirements for a brewery to even be called craft.

That means when you buy craft beer, you're supporting the idea of freedom and independence while getting the best beer possible. Seems like a real win-win situation.

You can take things one step further and experience a veritable "Pimp My Ride" level of freedom by choosing canned beer. With craft beer in a can, you gain the additional freedom to take your beer many more places that bottles just can't go like tailgating, the beach, and the pool. Canned beer is safe, gets cold quicker, and is better for the environment (as long as you recycle, which you obviously do, right?).

Independence and beer aren't always synonymous though. There are a growing number of "crafty" breweries today that look to be small, independent breweries but instead are owned by massive corporations that care less about independence and freedom and more about profit margins and marketing. Spend your hard-earned money where it makes the most impact, and that's with independent American breweries near and far.

Check out our list of independent American breweries below that love to can their beer, and while this list is VERY far from a complete list, it's a great start so you know what you're drinking not only for our nation's birthday, but all year long.

Anderson Valley Brewing Co.

Founded in California in 1987, Anderson Valley Brewing Co. originally had a small 10-barrel brewhouse that was in their original brewpub. Unlike today, there were about 20 craft breweries IN THE COUNTRY, making AVBC true pioneers in the craft brewing business. It didn't take long for the burgeoning brewery to outgrown their original digs, and by 1996 it was time for some serious growth in the form of a new 100-barrel brewhouse.

AVBC has pioneered quite a few trends in craft beer that we consider fairly normal today including their gose (pronounced go-zuh) series of beers and their partnership with Wild Turkey and their bourbon barrels.

Speaking of gose beers, Anderson Valley started canning their first version of this very old style of beer, known as "The Kimmie,

The Yink, & The Holy Gose" in 2014. This marked the first gose-style beer to see the inside of a can...ever. Today, you can find a variety of AVBC beers in cans, including their other gose beers like Blood Orange Gose, Briney Melon Gose, and the G&T Gose. Their Summer Solstice is joining in the craft can love, making it the perfect choice for long summer days.

Bell's Brewery

For 30 years and counting, Bell's Brewery has added to the craft brewing culture of America. From the early days of brewing with a 15-gallon soup pot in Kalamazoo to the 200-barrel brewhouse that's used today, Bell's is a serious craft beer contender.

Bell's is known both for their outstanding yearround beers as well as their special seasonal offerings. Since we're in the heart of summer, the best answer for what beer



you should have is pretty simple: Oberon. Summertime favorite Oberon from Bell's Brewery is out once again this summer and thankfully it's still coming in the aluminum receptacle that we love. Light and refreshing, you can find Oberon in multiple formats this year including the mini keg to help you with all your porch sitting and grass cutting, koozie not included.

Also available in cans this year is the year-round crowd favorite, Two Hearted Ale. Brewed with 100% Centennial hops and named after the Two Hearted River in Michigan, this beer is perfect all year. Coming in at 7% ABV and with the addition of cans to the lineup, Two Hearted is one beer that you'll be glad isn't seasonal.

Dogfish Head Craft Brewed Ales

When it comes to naming craft breweries off the top of your head, most people name Dogfish Head first, if not in their top 5. With a history longer than many craft breweries, Dogfish Head

is most well-known thanks to owner Sam Calagione and the short-lived reality show that focused on the brewery.

Known for using weird and wild ingredients, Dogfish Head rarely fails to impress us with their new and interesting beers. Looking at their canned offerings, their SeaQuench Ale is more than just a clever play on words. This seasonal sessionable sour beer is brewed with lime peel, black limes, and sea salt to give it a fresh, citrus character that mates perfectly with the sourness of this beer.

Another great canned beer from DFH is their Romantic Chemistry IPA that's brewed with mango, apricots, and ginger. This 7.2% ABV beer has enough bitterness to make hopheads happy while giving you a tropical fruit taste and aroma that balances things out nicely.

Heavy Seas Beer

The story of Heavy Seas Beer started back in 1994 when would-be founder Hugh Sisson left his family owned and operated brewpub to focus on larger scale brewing. In 1995 he founded Clipper City Brewing Company in Baltimore, Maryland. The Clipper City brewery focused primarily on those in and around Baltimore with both recipes and branding, as the clipper ship was first constructed in Baltimore, so they're pretty big fans of them there.

Jump ahead to today, and Heavy Seas Beer is a strong and multi-faceted brand that includes beers that run the gamut from low to high, light to dark, and strong to balanced in taste. In short, there's a beer for everyone in their lineup. A great example of independent brewing, Heavy Seas keeps things local to make some pretty amazing beer.

Take for example their Smooth Sail Summer Ale. Smooth Sail is a wheat ale that's brewed with orange and lemon peel, and was brewed to give the beer an airy mouthfeel and a nice frothy head. Head Brewer Chris Leonard says they employed a neutral strain of wheat yeast to produce a clean tasting beer that's delicate on the palate. In short, it's light, slightly hoppy, and citrusy to give you an amazingly refreshing summer beer, and at 4.5% ABV, it's easy to have a few while sitting on the porch and enjoying the nicer weather.

Another great canned beer from Heavy Seas is their flagship Loose Cannon IPA. You'd expect the flagship beer for a brewery to be pretty amazing, and Loose Cannon delivers on this in strides. This 7.25% ABV beer has an intense hop aroma thanks to Simcoe, Palisade, and Centennial hops, which give the beer a mix of grapefruit, herbs, and pine.

North Country Brewing Co.

Looking a little more locally, Slipper Rock's North Country

Brewing Company is an independent brewery that's all about canned beer. With more beers than we could list here, it's their primary lineup that keeps us coming back for more. The beers you can always expect to find from North Country include their Slimy Pebble Pils, Bucco Blonde Ale, Firehouse Red Ruby Ale, Paleo IPA, and Buck Snort Stout. Stinky Hippie, and Jack Frost Winter Warmer are also great examples of the magic of canned beer.

On top of these keystone beers, NCBC loves to experiment with sour beers, too. Be on the lookout for Lurnberry & Dinglegerry in the new Sour Series heading your way in July.



Smuttynose Brewing Co.

Brewing craft beer since 1994, Smuttynose Brewing Company calls New Hampshire home. Smuttynose Brewing saw its start thanks to a bankruptcy auction where the founder Peter Egelston purchased the equipment that he used to make the first Smuttynose beers.

From there the brewery grew but remained in New Hampshire and as independent as ever. Today Smuttynose makes a variety of beer that's consistently good and starting to be available in cans.

Starting off, Smuttynose will be canning their Summer IPA and Finestkind IPA, both with updated art and design on the outside, but the beer we love remaining the same on the inside.

Stone Brewing

Stone Brewing Co. was founded in 1996 by Greg Koch (pronounced "cook") and Steve Wagner in San Marcos, CA. The

first keg of beer ever produced by the brewery was their Stone Pale Ale, and while not in production today, it was the beer that launched an empire, so to speak. In their first year of brewing, Stone Brewing produced 400 barrels of beer, which was easily surpassed by the 2,100 barrels brewed in 1997. This tremendous growth has continued throughout Stone's history up to today. While Stone Brewing now has breweries on two continents, they remain fiercely independent and show that a brewery can succeed without selling out.

Like other craft breweries, Stone Brewing is embracing the move towards canned beer. While they have started canning their year-round favorites like Stone IPA, they're moving some of their seasonals and new releases to cans now, too. Take for example their new Ghost Hammer IPA. This 6.7% ABV beer is being released in cans and features Loral and Magnum hops to give it a refreshing, bitter flavor that's perfect for summer days and nights when you need a little liquid courage scaring off some ghosts of your own.

Their latest Enjoy By IPA that expires on July 4th this time around saw its first release in cans this time, and they're as patriotic as you'd expect. While you may have missed your chance at the Enjoy By 7-4-2017, fear not, as the canning was a wild success so we expect to see more of these come canned in the future.

Tröegs Independent Brewing

Tröegs Brewing Company was founded in 1996 in Harrisburg, PA by the Trogner brothers John and Chris. The name Tröegs came from a combination of a nickname including their last name and the Dutch word for pub, kroeg. The first keg sold by Tröegs took place in July 1997, officially kicking off the great beer we know and love today.

It would be hard to talk about canned beer and not mention the outstanding seasonal from Tröegs that's known as Nimble Giant. This hefty double IPA known as Nimble Giant. This 9% ABV imperial IPA is a late-summer seasonal that's only available in 16 oz. "pounder" cans and on draft. Brewed with Azacca, Mosaic, and Simcoe hops, Nimble Giant features notes of grapefruit rind, pineapple, and honeysuckle while keeping an earthy character that makes this IPA one that any hop head needs to try as soon

as possible.

Also coming back again this year in cans is Tröegs Brewing's Sunshine Pils, this year sporting its all-new artwork and design. This straw-golden Pilsner comes in at 4.5% ABV and is possibly one of the most refreshing beers you'll ever try. Brewed with Pilsner malt and both Hersbrucker and Saaz hops, this Eurostyle Pilsner is crisp and light while having a solid hop character. Perfect for just about any meal or a good day of yard work, Sunshine Pils is like sunshine in a can. Catch Sunshine Pils while you can, as it's only available in the summer months.

Summer is when the beautiful hibiscus flower blows, and Tröegs Brewing decided to take full advantage of it this year for their new Crimson Pistil Hibiscus IPA. This 6.2% ABV beer features a mix of berry-like tanginess, tropical hop notes, and a hearty dose of bitterness to give you your new favorite summertime beer.

The stigma of beer in cans being of poor quality or tasting like metal are quickly fading away, and just like the feeling of freedom we all experience every July 4th, the freedom of taking canned beer where you want while protecting not only yourself but the beer inside is one that more people are starting to experience. Show your love for independence and freedom and try some of these canned beers today.
