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
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

Brings Peruvian Food To the Strip!

Three years ago Pittsburgh's Strip District was privileged with a Peruvian jewel. At Chicken Latino owner Shelbin Santos offers fresh and local rotisserie chicken marinated overnight in a brew of tasty traditional spices. While you won't hear the secret recipe from her, you'll detect garlic, rosemary, and smoky Peruvian peppers, among other authentic Latin flavors. Rotisserie chicken marinated and slowly cooked in a brick oven to seal in the juices and flavor. Their chicken is served whole (17.50), half (9.50), or in quarters (6.50). Portions are generous and complimented by delicious sides, such as soaked-to-soften, slow cooked black beans, savory spanish rice, and coleslaw.

Santos, a psychologist, inherited a passion for cooking from her family in Peru, and in 2007 she set up shop in the Strip to share it with Pittsburghers. Her menu is sweet and simple, much like Chicken Latino's quaint and colorful atmosphere. Affordable appetizers include warm freshly made tortilla chips and salsa (2.99), yucca fries (compare to fried potatoes) (3.99), jalapeno poppers (3.99), and must-try sweet fried plantains (2.99). Her most popular dish features Peruvian chicken, moist, tasty and seasoned perfectly served with fresh cooked black beans atop plenty of spanish rice, with a touch of shredded cheese. Entrees range from 3.99 to 17.50.

If you happen to stop by during the weekend, try the signature ceviche made with lime-cured tilapia, or the Peruvian pork

roast, seasoned perfectly, so tender and moist it will have you coming back every weekend for more. Chicken Latino also offers American dishes like the grilled chicken sandwich, burgers, and salads. The menu also features popular Mexican meals as well but with a Peruvian twist such as burritos served crispy or soft, and chicken or veggie quesadillas. Definitely something for everyone!


What keeps guests coming is the homemade green sauce, a salsa verde, that will ignite your taste for Latin cuisine. Be warned, a little dab will do you. This secret blend of spices, cilantro, habanero, and jalapeno will take the chill right out of a Pittsburgh October. You'll need a good beverage with this, like genuine Peruvian cola, or fresh fruit juice. Fountain drinks are also available, but you can get Pepsi anywhere, right?

If you decide to get take-out, Santos asks that you call an hour ahead so she'll have time to make your meal fresh. Better yet, stay and eat in-house, where you can enjoy upbeat Peruvian art with your meal. Chicken Latino caters and is available for parties. Santos rents out the restaurant

and caters to any celebration. It is a BYOB restaurant, and best of all there is no charge for corking!

Located on 21st, Chicken Latino is an affordable, authentic Latin experience, hopefully serving up Peru to Pittsburgh for years to come. Hours Monday/Sunday are 11am-5pm, Tuesday-Thursday 11am-8pm, Friday 10am-8pm. Ingredients for Super Nacho Recipe

- 1 pound lean ground beef
 - 2 teaspoons chili powder
 - 2 teaspoons cumin
 - Pinch of salt
 - 1 small can refried beans or bean dip
 - 1 10 or 12-ounce bag corn tortilla chips
 - 1 1/4 pounds Monterey Jack or Mozzarella cheese, grated
 - 1 large onion, chopped
 - 2 tomatoes, chopped
 - 1 6-ounce can black olives, chopped
- Easy to follow instructions for Super Nacho Recipe



1. Brown the ground beef in a medium skillet. Drain. Add the chili powder, cumin and salt. Set aside for a moment.
2. Spread a thin layer of refried beans or bean dip over the bottom of a platter or shallow, heat-proof bowl to anchor the first layer of chips.
3. Then spread a layer of chips over the beans, top with a layer of cheese, ground beef, onion, tomato and olives. Repeat until all the ingredients are used. Or, since this recipe usually makes about 4 layers, you can divide all the toppings into 4 portions for even layering.
4. Microwave on high until heated through, about 10 minutes, or bake at 375° for 20-30 minutes. Serve warm with sour cream and Guacamole Dip, if desired.

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

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Travel During Thanksgiving, or any holiday is extra stressful. Here are some tips to help ease some of that stress.

1. Try to plan your travel at a non-peak time. For example, I am flying almost a week before and leaving the day after. My flight is about \$350 cheaper than it would have, had I decided to fly just a couple of days before or decided to stay through the weekend. If you are driving, keep in mind that traffic will be heaviest the day before and the day after. Be vigilant.
2. Don't leave too early the day after. Remember that the Friday after Thanksgiving is "Black Friday," the day most retailers have amazing sales that lure everyone to the stores very earlier in the morning. People will get up early to try to get to the stores before everyone else, and traffic will be heavy. If you must leave early on Friday, give yourself plenty of time to get to the airport.
3. If you are flying, the day before is by far the worst time, as everyone is trying to get home at the same time. Between the crowds and the overbooked flights, flying the day before is just not a good idea. If you can't travel at a non-peak time, you should be able to leave early on Thanksgiving and still make it in time for dinner, depending on the distance you have to fly.
4. If you are driving, the best time to leave is actually on Thanksgiving evening, when everyone is sleeping off the meal or engrossed in the football games.
5. Do things backwards. Get dropped off at the arrivals entrance (rather than departures), and get picked up at the departures entrance (rather than arrivals). Think about it this way: if everyone is trying to leave at the same time, the arrivals area will be practically empty. Not many flights arrive early in the morning. Likewise, getting picked up at the departures can be a good idea, as it should be less busy.
6. If you are flying through a large airport, check in at a different concourse. I used this trick at the JFK airport in New York one time. It looked like all the traffic was going to one concourse, so I went to another that looked less busy. I

got through security practically in a matter of seconds and walked to my gate about a half hour before anyone else arrived. It made for a stress-free experience and got me on the plane faster, which ensured I had room for my carry-on in the overhead compartment.

Note: This works only if the airport has concourses that are connected within the same building. Phoenix, for example, is not all in one building. You have to go outside, get on a bus, and then go through security again if you leave one concourse to get to another. Know your airport's layout before you try this one.

7. If you are driving, plan your route to avoid big cities. Most cities have a route that goes around the city, like taking 640 around Knoxville rather than staying on 40 and driving through the city. If you can't avoid the big city, at least plan your timing to avoid the big cities at peak traffic times (morning and evening commutes and lunch time).
8. Keep your radio tuned to a station that keeps you updated on accidents and road congestion. Download a program to your smart phone that gives live updates of traffic conditions. Make use of programs like Live Traffic to check the conditions before you head out on your Thanksgiving travel. Avoid these areas to avoid delays.
9. When you travel during the Thanksgiving holiday, there will be delays. It is inevitable. Try to make the most of it. Bring that book you have been meaning to read. (If you are driving, get a book on tape.) Bring some travel-friendly games. Keep your cell phone charger in your carry-on so that you can use your phone freely during long layovers and other airport delays without worrying about the battery going dead. Bring plenty of snacks so you don't have to spend too much on airport food or gas station snacks.
10. Complete routine vehicle maintenance and do extra checks on your brakes, fluids, etc., before heading out. Nothing ruins a road trip like car trouble, no matter what time of the year. However, in many parts of the country, snow can be part of the equation for your Thanksgiving travel. Especially make sure your tires are in excellent condition.



Seared Duck Breast with Raspberry Gastrique

Serve with *Kendall-Jackson Zinfandel*



Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- ½ C. red verjus
- ½ C. red wine, such as Zinfandel
- ½ pint raspberries
- 2 Tbsp. pomegranate molasses
- 20 black peppercorns
- 2 cloves
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- Kosher salt, to taste
- 1 tsp. vegetable oil
- 4 duck breasts

Servings: 6

Raspberry Gastrique Preparation: In a small sauce pan, caramelize the sugar over low heat. Once the sugar turns golden brown, carefully add the verjus, wine, raspberries, pomegranate molasses, peppercorns and cloves. Increase the heat to high and reduce for 5 to 7 minutes or until most of the liquid has evaporated and the sauce begins to thicken to syrup consistency. Remove from the heat and whisk in butter. Season with salt. Keep warm.

Duck Preparation: In a 12-inch non-stick sauté pan, heat the oil over medium-high for 2 minutes. Score the duck breast on the fat-side, being careful not to cut into the meat. Season the duck with salt and carefully place in the pan skin-side down. Reduce the heat to medium-low and slowly render as much of the fat in the skin as possible. Drain the fat that collects in the pan every 2 to 5 minutes. Continue to cook until the skin turns brown and crisps slightly, approximately 10 to 15 minutes. Flip the breasts, increase the heat back to medium-high and continue to cook for an additional 2 minutes (for medium-rare to medium). If using an instant-read thermometer, the temperature should register between 136-140°F.

Final Preparation: Remove the duck from the pan and rest on a cutting board for 4 to 5 minutes before cutting. Drizzle the Raspberry Gastrique on the duck and serve.

Capellini with Clams

Serve with *Kendall-Jackson Chardonnay*



Ingredients

- 6 Tbsp. unsalted butter
- 1½ lb. clams, scrubbed
- ½ C. dry white wine
- 12 oz. capellini or angel hair pasta
- ½ C. loosely packed fresh flat-leaf parsley, coarsely chopped
- 1 bunch chives, cut into ½ pieces
- kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

In a large, heavy saucepan, melt the butter over medium-high heat and cook until the butter is brown and has released a nutty aroma, 3-4 minutes. Add the clams, increase the heat to high, and stir in the wine. Cover and cook until the clams open, 4-6 minutes. Transfer the clams with tongs or a slotted spoon to a plate. Discard any clams that don't open.

Meanwhile, in a large pot of salted boiling water, cook the pasta until al dente, about 6-8 minutes. Drain the pasta and add to the pan with the butter mixture. Add the parsley and chives. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Toss to coat evenly. Divide the pasta among 6 small plates, top each serving with an equal number of clams, and serve.

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Ask The Attorney

Ask The Lawyer: "Legal Briefs" Courtesy Of Local Attorney / Mediator / Collaborative Settlement Advocate Jeff Pollock

As mentioned in my previous column, while drumming up support for my 2011 East End Magistrate Campaign, a couple asked me for legal advice about their daughter's marital issues, including how best to resolve her divorce and custody matters. Here is the second part about Mediation.

Q: How does Mediation specifically address Divorce/Custody/Support/Equitable Distribution?

A: In short: Litigation is the tried and true -- and sometimes necessary way -- of resolving contentious Family Law matters, but Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) methods may be preferable in many cases in terms of time involved, stress exacerbated, fees incurred, costs charged, etc. The first alternative that should be considered is Mediation.

Some families and some situations call for "A Quiet Divorce" to keep the details of their divorce out of the public eye. Troubled couples with high visibility, income, or wealth may wish to use a private method like Mediation to keep their divorce terms away from public scrutiny for personal, business, or financial reasons. It is a method for resolving disputes collaboratively. In mediation, people work together to identify, discuss and jointly resolve the issues in dispute. Mediating offers significant advantages over litigation and other processes, such as: a) Saving time and money; b) Preserving valued relationships, especially if children are involved; c) Reducing stress and animosity; and d) Making the parties more invested in the outcome.

Most divorcing couples can't communicate productively on their own. But given proper help, most divorcing couples are capable of deciding how to distribute their property and support their children, just as they did during marriage. A professional mediator meets with both parties together in an effort to negotiate a fair settlement. One spouse is never pitted against the other.

Mediation is best suited for couples who want to minimize their lawyers' direct involvement in negotiation and retain more control over negotiating the terms of their divorce. Spouses can use this process to resolve parenting issues as well as financial matters. Spouses meet jointly with a mediator, usually without their attorneys present. The mediator is not an advocate for either spouse, but is a neutral facilitator chosen by both parties. Mediators come from a variety of disciplines (e.g., attorneys, financial planners or mental health professionals), but who should have training as mediators and experience in divorce. In mediation you work together with the other person to resolve your dispute without a judge or jury.

The mediator guides you through a process of identifying, discussing, and resolving the issues raised by the participants. The two parties make all decisions, including what issues are discussed, what additional information may be needed, and how each issue is resolved. The mediator assists you but does not substitute his/her judgment for yours. The mediator helps them reach a mutual resolution on their own terms. The mediator controls the process, not the outcome. The three people meet until either full agreement is reached or the negotiations fail. One of the most frustrating and painful

aspects of litigation is the feeling that someone else controls your destiny. In mediation, you are directly involved in all decision-making so you need not worry that important decisions about your future will be imposed on you.

Mediation puts you in control of the process, which helps reduce costs. The parties decide who will participate in the mediation, whether attorneys or other experts will be present, what will be the length and frequency of mediation sessions, etc. All discussions that take place with the mediator are confidential. A mediator cannot be called as a witness or forced to divulge any information in the event mediation is not successful and litigation occurs.

Resolving a dispute doesn't have to mean the end of an important relationship. The mediation process encourages effective confidential communication by: a) Affording each person opportunities to have concerns addressed; b) Improving opportunities to find common ground; c) Encouraging clear communication; d) Deterring misunderstandings; e) Making it more likely that both sides can feel like they "won;" and f) Allowing for more open sharing at meetings since the parties get to keep the written settlement papers out of the files of the Prothonotary/Dept of Court Records.

In summary, the benefits of Mediation are:

1) Speed A mediator can meet with a couple as often as weekly. After about 4-6 sessions, the parties usually reach the point at which an agreement can be drafted. To properly prepare for litigation, lawyers may spend at least that long just collecting information.

2) Cost Expense is a function of speed and complexity. The combined fee for a mediated agreement is usually less than the retainer that one spouse may have to pay. All of a mediator's time is spent working towards an agreement without being sidetracked by filing/arguing pleadings, discovery, and motions.

3) Professionalism A good mediator will insist on full disclosure by the parties and inform the divorcing couple of all financial and child-custody issues and possible outcomes that must be reviewed openly and provided for in the agreement. The mediator will also help the couple overcome impasses in their negotiations without needlessly pressuring either party.

4) Fairness The world of divorce is not different from the world of marriage - not everything is "fair." But two people who have worked to reach an agreement that both parties can live with feel far more satisfied with its fairness than a couple told by a judge how to conduct their affairs.

5) Closure Instead of realizing the litigators' adage that "Divorce never ends" (since a drawn-out acrimonious divorce can create painful repercussions far into the future), Mediators usually help divorcing spouses to put the past behind them. A mediated divorce arguably offers people a better chance to start anew.

Above The Fold - Ben Folds Returns To Pittsburgh

Autumn is upon us, and that chill you feel in the air should be a reminder that another outdoor concert season is behind us and it's time to seek shelter for your live music fix. Lucky for us though, a night of blistering hot piano rock is coming to Club Zoo this November to kick off the fall when singer/keyboardist Ben Folds brings his Lonely Avenue Tour to town.

Ben Folds last performance in Pittsburgh is going to be hard to beat when he had a 100-piece backing band – the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. February 2010 brought a new experience for Ben Folds' fans – a trip to Heinz hall and a chance to experience him in a rare, intimate setting.

Folds' new album however, a collaboration with author Nick Hornby may just up that bar. Hornby is the author of the novel *High Fidelity*, which was made into a popular film starring John Cusack, and *About a Boy*, again a hit on the silver screen. *Lonely Avenue* takes Hornby's lyrics and juxtaposes them against Ben Folds' melodic and memorable piano melodies.

Ben Folds is best known as the leader of the power pop trio Ben Folds Five, but has also struck out on his own as a solo artist. Despite playing in bands in high school, his musical career didn't really get off the ground until the late '80s, as a bassist for Majosha (the outfit issued such obscure releases as *Party Night: Five Songs About Jesus and Shut Up and Listen to Majosha*). Proving his multi-instrumental talents, Folds also played drums as a session musician in Nashville. After relocating to New York, Folds started acting again (he'd done some theater in high school previously) and signed a publishing deal with Sony Music.

Moving back to North Carolina, Folds in 1994 formed Ben Folds Five, a trio that also included bassist Robert Sledge and drummer Darren Jessee. Whereas most alternative bands of the '90s specialized in distorted teen-angst rock, the guitarless trio was a refreshing break from the norm, their sound akin to such past power popsters as Todd Rundgren, Jellyfish, early Joe Jackson, and such piano-driven artists as Billy Joel and early Elton John. But like punk bands, Ben Folds Five put on a

high-energy, blistering live show. The band was signed to the independent Caroline Records shortly afterward, resulting in their self-titled debut one year later. Due to airings of their humorous anthem "Underground" (which poked fun at the politics of the punk/alternative scene) on MTV's *120 Minutes* and constant touring, quite a buzz was stirring for the band by the time of their second album.

Released in 1997, *Whatever and Ever Amen* was pure pop perfection – easily one of the year's best releases and perhaps the best power pop release of the '90s. The band's songwriting and sound had improved even further, as evidenced by such gems as "One Angry Dwarf and 200 Solemn Faces," "Fair," "Kate," and "Battle of Who Could Care Less," plus their whimsical tribute to breakups, "Song for the Dumped." But it was the ballad "Brick" that broke the band commercially – unlike the majority of their material, which was upbeat, the song contained melancholic music and vocals, as the lyrics told the story of a teenage couple who decides to get an abortion (it has been speculated that the tale was autobiographical for Folds). The single didn't hit until several months after the album was released, which meant that the band stayed on the road for well over a year, playing with such notables as Dave Matthews, Beck, and as part of the 1997 H.O.R.D.E. festival – earning *Whatever* platinum status.

While 1998 didn't see a new studio album by the band, BF5's former label issued a 16-track rarities collection (*Naked Baby Photos*), as Folds released his first solo album, *Volume 1*, under the pseudonym *Fear of Pop*. Although the album went largely unnoticed, it included the song "In Love," which included overly dramatic vocals from none other than Captain Kirk himself, William Shatner (comparable in approach to Shatner's must-hear 1968 album, *The Transformed Man*) and which was performed on *The Conan O'Brien Show* shortly after the album's release. Ben Folds Five regrouped with 1999's *The Unauthorized Biography of Reinhold Messner*, which was a more mature work than its predecessors, although the energetic lead-off single, "Army," showed that Folds' humorous approach hadn't dulled at all.

Folds officially went solo again in 2001 with *Rockin' the Suburbs*. A series of EPs followed, with the new long-player *Songs for Silverman* dropping in 2005. He released *Supersunnyspeedgraphic: The LP* in 2006, followed by the full-length *Way to Normal* in 2008. In 2009 Folds contributed two songs to *University A Cappella*, a collection of covers of some of Folds' best tracks by various university groups.

Let's Get Naked - Barenaked Ladies Kick It In Da 'Burgh

Imagine a shrine for all great sayings, a Pop Psychology Hall of Fame if you will. On these special walls you'd find such stalwarts as "What Doesn't Kill You Makes You Stronger," "Tomorrow's Another Day" and "Everything Happens For A Reason." Right over there the "Light At The End of The Tunnel" stands next to "The Great Unknown." Sure, these sayings are ubiquitous; repeated down through the ages as mantra for some, cliché for others. But now, after 20 years together, Barenaked Ladies are taking time to walk these halls and learn from another bon mot, All In Good Time.

Yes, All In Good Time is the name of the new album, the 11th from this Canadian institution, and their first as a new four-piece. Fourteen bold and adventurous new tracks, recorded in Toronto in the spring and summer of 2009, find Ed Robertson (guitar/vocals), Jim Creeggan (bass/vocals), Kevin Hearn (keyboard/guitar/vocals) and Tyler Stewart (drums/vocals) exploring a very creative and fertile phase of their careers.

"There was a little more room for people to breathe on this record" says Robertson. "It's more rocking in places and it stretches out and becomes more spacious in others. It was a really good feeling in the studio, with everyone very comfortable together and Michael at the helm."

Robertson is referring to ace producer and long-time BNL collaborator Michael Phillip Wojewoda, who produced the band's very first full length CD, 1992's *Gordon*. Wojewoda jumped at the chance to capture the group's rebirth as a quartet. "The newness of the situation inspired the band to stretch musically," says Wojewoda. "Even though there were challenges, they jumped in headfirst with enthusiasm and passion. The results are very exciting. It was great to be part of that."

The move from five to four could be a tough transition for a lesser group, but Barenaked Ladies are no ordinary rock band. Founded as a duo in 1988 by schoolmates Ed Robertson and Steven Page, the group soon grew to five members and took Canada by storm with their five-song indie cassette, *The Yellow Tape*. Over the next decade-plus, their albums *Gordon*, *Rock Spectacle*, *Stunt* and *Maroon* went multi-platinum in the U.S., and Barenaked Ladies became a top-selling, award-winning concert draw across North America and The U.K. with their frenetic blend of high-energy melodic-pop, crack

musicianship and spontaneous repartee.

Ed Robertson, the primary songwriter since the birth of the band, took a moment to share how the writing process for All In Good Time was different from past Barenaked Ladies albums. "This was a chance for me to shed some of my writing dependencies, both good and bad, and explore new ground. I allowed myself to go places that I might not have in the past. I was more literal at times, and more abstract at others, pushing the self-imposed limits I'd adhered to for too long. The writing was cathartic for me in a way that writing hadn't been since the early nineties. It had been a huge and often dark year: an arrest, a plane crash and the death of my mother. All of these things took a heavy toll on my psyche, and spurred a lot of serious exploring."

Regarding the line-up change in Barenaked Ladies, Robertson is very candid: "Our relationship with Steve Page was great and very fruitful. It lasted almost 20 years, but it was time to move on. Now we're doing something that feels really fresh and exciting to me. His departure left four singers and three multi-instrumentalists in the band, so we're not lacking for musical ideas, and now there's more room for the other writers in the band to bring songs to the table."

The results of Robertson's personal explorations can be heard in the standout first track/lead single "You Run Away," a story of missed opportunities and remorse: "I tried to be your brother / You cried and ran for cover / I made a mess, who doesn't? / I did my best but it wasn't enough."

In the brisk, angular rocker "How Long," Robertson kicks off the lines "Give it up for Anger, it makes us strong!" another echo of recent years for the famous father of three. On the power-pop "Every Subway Car," the founding singer/guitarist takes on the angst of a love-struck guerilla artiste: "Soon the world will see / Our graffiti love / Belton on my glove / They'll wonder who you are on every subway car."

Finally, Robertson finds three rhymes for the apparently unrhymable word Orange in a Django Reinhardt meets Jay-Z beer-hall sing-along called "Four Seconds": "Oh Flip, The light is turning Orange / Coat ripped, when I caught it in the door hinge / I slipped when the lady in the 4 inch / Bought it in a store in Germany." Even after a couple of years of ups and downs, Barenaked Ladies have hung on to their abstract senses of humour.

The result of new contributions from within is a recording that is stylistically adventurous, musically diverse and the most emotionally riveting and honest work by the band to date. "We had a bizarre year in 08," says drummer and vocalist Tyler Stewart. "A lot of upheaval, a lot of changes, but 12 months later we're stronger than we've ever been. We had to dig deep and redefine ourselves. Right now it feels really, really good to be in Barenaked Ladies."

All In Good Time, the 11th Studio Album from Barenaked Ladies, drops in March 2010. You can catch a sneak peek in Pittsburgh on Thursday, November 11 at Carnegie Library Music Hall of Homestead. Got Wood? Two Bands, One Amazing Low-End



I'm a bassist. We're a strange breed. For instance, I'm writing an article about another bassist. Not a band, not a musical, not a symphony performance. A bassist. One man, one instrument – well, two, he plays vertically and horizontally – and two amazing ensembles of completely different genres with which he plays.

I learned about Chris Wood when I was at a music school party in 1998. After many, many beers, some jazzier friends put on Combustication. I remember asking at least five times, "Who is this?" Thoroughly irritated, they screamed at me, "MEDESKI, MARTIN AND WOOD." I said, "Oh, like a law firm."

Medeski, Martin and Wood (MMW), however, is much more than a law firm. Formed in 1992, MMW is a jazz trio consisting of piano/keys, bass and drums. Don't think jazz like you normally would in Pittsburgh... they are the opposite end of the spectrum from Joe Negri, Sean Jones, or Catch 22. MMW takes jazz out to the edge until you wonder, "How are they going to bring this back?" Every time, like a miracle, it comes back to the head and the groove kicks in.

It's no miracle. All of these guys are the epitome of professional musicians. Chris Wood spent a short stint at New England Conservatory studying academic music. Realizing that he could be doing much more with the bass, he dropped out of classes completely and stayed only for the private lessons with geniuses like Dave Holland, Geri Allen, Bob Moses, George Garzone, and Jerry Bergoozi. Lessons were really all Chris needed, especially with the pedagogs he had at his disposal coupled with his natural talent.

Chris also had other major influences in his playing, but long before he hit college. His father, Bill Wood was always playing guitar and singing folk tunes around the house. A student at Harvard in the late 50's, Bill was heavily influenced by the burgeoning folk scene of that period and

played and recorded with many of the pioneers in the genre (you can still see Bill's face on the cover of a booklet included in a Joan Baez box set).

Also, keeping Chris' influences current was his brother Oliver who turned him onto sixties rock like The Doors, Jimi Hendrix, The Who and the Beatles. Oliver had followed his father's footsteps as a guitar player and in that spirit, got an electric bass for Christmas one year. While Chris was in 7th grade his brother switched to the electric guitar leaving the bass behind. Chris picked up the leftovers and began his journey.

Oliver and Chris Wood grew up in Boulder, Colorado, the sons of a Poet and a Microbiologist. Oliver moved to Atlanta and became a southerner. Chris moved to New York City and became a Yankee. After years of musical and geographical separation they have reunited as The Wood Brothers.

While in Atlanta, Oliver soaked up the roots of blues, the soul of the south, and found he had a talent for writing and singing songs. His band, King Johnson (named after Freddy King and Robert Johnson) toured mostly in the southern states. Meanwhile, Chris was living in Manhattan playing everything from free jazz to rock and roll. This is where he met his band mates to form Medeski Martin & Wood.

The Wood Brothers collaboration combines their shared childhood influences with everything they've learned since leaving home. Their music has a rootsy feel that blends blues, folk, and rock music in a guitar/bass duo.

MMW hits Pittsburgh on Saturday, November 13, at Mr. Smalls in Millvale. Tickets are \$25 and can be purchased at www.mrsmalls.com. The Wood Brothers grace us with their pure musical style on Thursday, December 9, at Club Café on the South Side. 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

In the following years she traveled the world and recorded various songs with a star-studded group which included great names

In addition, to her musical work, the International Red Cross in Montreaux appointed her International Ambassador (2004), making her the first Cuban artist to achieve such a distinction; and her recording, Flor de amor was nominated for a Grammy in the Best Traditional Tropical Record category. In the 16th edition of the Billboard Latin Music Awards, in 2005, Flor de amor obtained the Tropical Record of the Year award in the female category. Ms. Portuondo's recording Gracias is an album that highlights her 60 year career

evening. Since opening on April 8th, Saga is already seeing repeat business and building a solid customer base. We cannot wait to tell you why!

We start at the bar. Happy Hour at SAGA is from 4:30pm - 6:30pm, with two-dollar domestics and two-dollars off well drinks. SAGA offers a full bar. Bar Manager Gina started us with a Pineapple Passion (\$6.00). This is a creamy coconut rum concoction with pineapple juice. Gina likens it to a "pineapple cotton candy", not too sweet, not too fruity - a perfect blend of flavors. If you are planning to take a date

or want to cozy up to someone special during this holiday season, we recommend the SAGA Volcano (\$14.00). This drink is large enough to share with two straws; a definite "Must try!" The Volcano is a combination of gin, rum, and vodka with tangy orange and pineapple juices, served flaming! They also offer an award winning "living & breathing" wine list that compliments both their lunch and dinner selections.

Gina definitely knows her way around the bar. She has created a whole menu to choose from of original martinis.

She quickly reminds us that Saga has plenty of non-alcoholic options and fun specialty drinks for children. We tried a Japanese orange soda - highly carbonated and tastily tart in a colorful glass bottle. SAGA offers Edamame, salted soybeans (in pods) a healthy alternative to bar nuts. bamboo, the presentation was spectacular. There was fresh cut Ahi tuna, salmon, flounder, snapper, and yellow fin. Definitely tender, delicious, top quality and the freshness of an ocean catch.

Next, we were off to the hibachi grill. The room is spacious yet extremely comfortable and personal. The servers quickly served us a bowl of soup, a clear chicken and beef based broth garnished with mushroom and shallots very tasty, and definitely not salty. Next, the salads served with Saga's homemade house dressing, very creamy with a hint



of apples and oranges, one of the best Japanese dressings we have ever tried.

Hibachi Chef Victor emerged from the kitchen and introduces himself. With ten years of experience, he is engaging and poised at the grill. We watch mesmerized as he turns stir-fry into a fascinating experience. He quickly ignites the grill and flames erupt like an inferno. He balances and cracks an egg with just a spatula, quickly slices an onion into a flaming and steaming volcano. A minute into this charismatic show, he quickly proceeds to make a heart-shaped rice mound sizzling on the grill, which he brings to life with a throb from the spatula. Next, we watch as the vegetables cook, with precision and care. Then he proudly presents us with a glimpse of what's going onto the grill. He turns this meat and seafood platter into mouth watering delicacies all seasoned to perfection and not overly saturated with soy sauce. Saga only uses low sodium soy sauce, which truly enhances and lets the flavors blend rather than over powered with soy sauce. The filet was melt in your mouth tender, cooked to perfection. The chicken was moist and extremely flavorful as was the shrimp and scallops, delicious! The lobster tails were perfectly grilled and succulent – no dipping butter required, you will want to savor every bite. SAGA serves very generous portions and their prices are extremely moderate for the quality and quantity of food they serve. 




